ANNUAL SCHOOL REPORT TO THE COMMUNITY

The South Carolina Education Finance Act of 1977 requires the School Improvement Council to submit an Annual School Report to the Community. In compliance with this requirement, Augusta Circle offers the following school wide goals and strategies:

Goal I: From the school year 2008 – 2009 through the school year 2012-2013, the percent of students in grades 3 – 5 scoring Met or Exemplary on PASS English/Language Arts will increase by 2% each year.

In 2008-2009 – 89.9% of our students scored Met or Exemplary on ELA.

In 2009-2010 – 92.6% of our students scored Met or Exemplary on ELA.

In 2010-2011 – 91.9% of our students scored Met or Exemplary on ELA.

In the first three years of measuring student achievement in PASS ELA, our students increased their scores by an average of 2% each year.

Strategies we will use to improve our 2012 scores include:

1. Provide students with opportunities to communicate orally and in writing for different audiences and purposes.
2. Use strategies learned in Quality Tools training to strengthen the ELA curriculum.

Goal II: From the school year 2008 – 2009 through the school year 2012 – 2013, the percent of students in grades 3-5 scoring Met or Exemplary on PASS math will increase by 2% each year.

In 2008-2009 – 90.9% of our students scored Met or Exemplary on math.

In 2009-2010 – 91.2% of our students scored Met or Exemplary on math.

In 2010-2011 – 89.2% of our students scored Met or Exemplary on math.

In the first three years of measuring student achievement in PASS math, our students' scores decreased by 1.7%.

Strategies we will use to improve our 2012 scores include:

1. Send home a list of recommended web sites for summer math practice.
2. Send home a math packet of problems for students to review math during the summer.
2. Use math review in class at least 3 times a week.
3. Provide students in grades 3-5 with opportunities to use higher level thinking skills to solve problems, demonstrate knowledge in a variety of ways and use technology to support learning math.
4. Increase student skills with basic math facts by administering timed math facts tests each week after January.
