## Bucket Filling Launch at Bryson Elementary - Mrs. Mills

### ◆ What is Bucket Filling?

The idea of Bucket Fillers is based on Dr. Donald O. Clifton's metaphor of the bucket and the dipper. The first person to bring this idea to a school setting was "The Bucket Man", Merrill Lundgren.

Several books have been written about bucket fillers. Carol McCloud wrote a book called "Have You Filled a Bucket Today? (A Guide to Daily Happiness for Kids)". The premise of the book is the idea that we all carry an invisible bucket that contains our feelings. When our bucket is full, we feel great. When our bucket is empty, we feel sad. Bucket filler is someone who says or does nice things for other people. By doing this, they are filling other people's buckets and filling their own bucket at the same time. On the other hand, a bucket dipper says or does things to cause other people to feel bad. A bucket dipper empties their bucket when they say and do mean things.

### ◆ How does Bryson Use Bucket Filling?

Teachers and staff each received buckets outside their door for the 2011-2012 school years. Our school community is a place where kindness is modeled and bucket filling is a way to strengthen that. Our staff completes bucket filling cards for acknowledging a job well done. It is very exciting to find a card in your bucket from a colleague. Bucket Filling is a simple way to make someone feel special and appreciated.

### ◆ How are our students using bucket filling?

To spread Bucket Filling School - wide, in January, each class will receive a class bucket. Classes will receive cotton balls to fill up buckets for acts of kindness of rule following. If a staff member catches a class modeling exemplary behavior, they will give the teacher a cotton ball to place in the class bucket. Once a class bucket is full, the buckets will be poured into a large school wide bucket. It is expected that we will have a school celebration once our large bucket is filled.

### ◆ What is the future of Bucket Filling at Bryson Elementary?

Our goal is that every classroom will become a bucket filling classroom over the next few years. Research shows that a positive school environment will impact student achievement and learning. Through bucket filling in all grades, we give our students a chance to complement each other and work towards a common goal of kindness.

### Coaches Corner - Shannon Land

Our Bryson Bears are A.C.E.S.—All Children Experiencing Success!

Parents, please work with your children every day to give them the support they need. Here are some simple ways to help your child start and continue good study habits:

- ◆ Set aside time each day to go through your child's school papers. Try to do it first thing after school when your child's day is fresh in his/her mind. Be sure to sign any communication for the teacher to let her know you have seen your child's work.
- ◆ Look over your youngster's work together. Help him/her feel proud by making a specific

comment about something he/she has done. For instance, if he/she shows you a picture he/she drew in art class, you might say, "The gray sky and big waves look just like our rainy day the beach."

- ◆ Have him/her talk through math problems or science experiments to show you what he/she has learned. Your child might explain how he/she finds the perimeter of a triangle or why ants dig tunnels, for instance.
- ◆ Always assist him/her with homework if necessary, but do not complete the assignment for him/her. It is important that your child learns that he/she is responsible for the work.

## Kindergarten News

Our kindergarteners are enjoying a variety of learning experiences. During Time Travel/Decade Day, our students learned a lot about the popular trends of the 2000's decade in literature, music, sports, and technology.

In class, they are learning how to write their last names, make lists, and write simple sentences using our handy editor's checklist. Our students are also learning how to summarize stories, and the list of popcorn words they can read and write is growing too!

In math, these youngsters are learning the numbers 11 to 20, counting and comparing groups of objects, and counting by ones and tens. They are estimating and measuring the weight and length of objects, collecting data, and building/using a picture graph.

Additionally, the kindergarteners enjoy going to the computer lab to reinforce these skills. To celebrate the 50th Day of School, the children made homemade milkshakes because this was a popular treat during the 1950's. We talked about the different forms of matter (solid to liquid). We can't wait to celebrate the 100<sup>th</sup> day of school! It's going to be a lot of fun.

In science, social studies, and health, the students are observing seasonal changes, learning how to compare family life of the past to the present, and fun, yet educational music and movement activities to keep their bodies strong and healthy.

## Mrs. Coggins' Music Notes

## Physical Education News

We have been working on soccer skills in the gym.

Kindergartners, first graders and second graders have been learning to dribble and trap the ball while third, fourth and fifth graders have reviewed dribbling and trapping, they have also learned about tackling the ball and making lead passes.

Third through fifth graders have been assessed on their skills and first and second graders are honing in on their ball control.

Standards based assessments are 20% of the grade that students receive in physical education and participation is 80% of the grade.

When students do not wear tennis shoes to class they receive a daily grade of 75 which impacts their overall grade for the nine weeks. Please encourage your student to wear tennis shoes every day so they can participate in physical activity and at recess

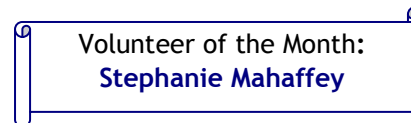
