





REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

Eastside High School is a top national comprehensive high school that offers a rigorous academic curriculum for all students. Our students excel academically, athletically, and in the arts. Eastside is seen as a unique and strong learning environment for all of the approximately 1,400 students who attend. Our staff seeks continuous professional advancement by attending conferences, leading seminars, teaching classes, holding committee and officer positions at the local, state, and national level in various professional organizations. Our teachers work together in subject specific groups and across subject areas to plan meaningful instruction for our students at all levels. The teachers of all subjects have focused on implementing literacy skills throughout every classroom this year. Our primary goal at Eastside is to improve all student performance by emphasizing our three main priority areas; the diversification of teaching strategies, encouraging a climate of inclusiveness, and increasing all student achievement. We center our professional development on sharing and evaluating instructional strategies which focus on these areas. Eastside also has teacher led committees (action teams) which work to improve student performance by examining school data, researching professional development ideas, working on scheduling to minimize disruptions to learning, and implementing school wide tutoring programs. We also maintain and continuously grow partnerships with parent and community groups to strengthen home to school bonds as well as community relations. Our school wide tutoring program, rewarding academic achievement program, and Hispanic outreach program are examples of the partnerships. Parents and community members serve as tutors, provide snacks and meals for participants, and cost for transportation home for students. We have plans to continue growing these programs in future years. The 2014-2015 school year promises new and exciting progress. We will add to our student enrollment as well as our number of teachers. Eastside High School is ready to continue our over forty year tradition of excellence!
