Registration


- Beginning March 16: Students will register for courses with counselors through English classes
- Students will pick enough courses to total seven credits as well as three alternate courses


Registration Calendar

- March 16-March 20: The online system will be available for students
- During this time, computers will be available in Guidance by appointment for families that do not have internet access

Online System for Students

- Counselors will give students a generated web username and password (the same login for the portal)
- Students will log on to the registration website and click on the Class Registration icon
- The registration screen will appear





Registration Calendar

- April 8: Students will receive a print out of recommended and requested courses to be signed and returned (this sheet will come home with 3rd quarter report cards)
- April 13: Students return signed print out of course requests with elective changes- Deadline to make elective changes!
- May 27: Students will receive a copy of their schedule
- May 29: Deadline for students to return schedule with necessary changes

Schedule Changes

- The deadline to change course requests is April 13th (after course request letters are sent home)
- After schedules are sent home May 27th, changes will be made for the following reasons ONLY:
 - Student does not have a full schedule or there is a conflict
 - Student has a duplicate course
 - Student has already passed a course on schedule
 - Student fails a course at the end of the year and needs to be placed back in the course
 - Student is a senior and is missing a graduation requirement or a college admissions requirement

Parent Overrides



- When a parent is requesting a change in level different from what a teacher has recommended
- Signing the override does not mean the teacher agrees with change in level- just that all parties met to discuss the change.
- Deadline is April 28th We will NOT take any overrides after this day!

Parent Overrides

- A face to face conference is required with parent, student, and recommending teacher (AP teacher should also meet if moving up to AP).
- One of the following should occur:
 - If the teacher does not agree in level change, an Override Form should be signed by all parties and turned in to guidance ASAP
 - If there is a change in the teacher recommendation, the teacher will notify guidance


