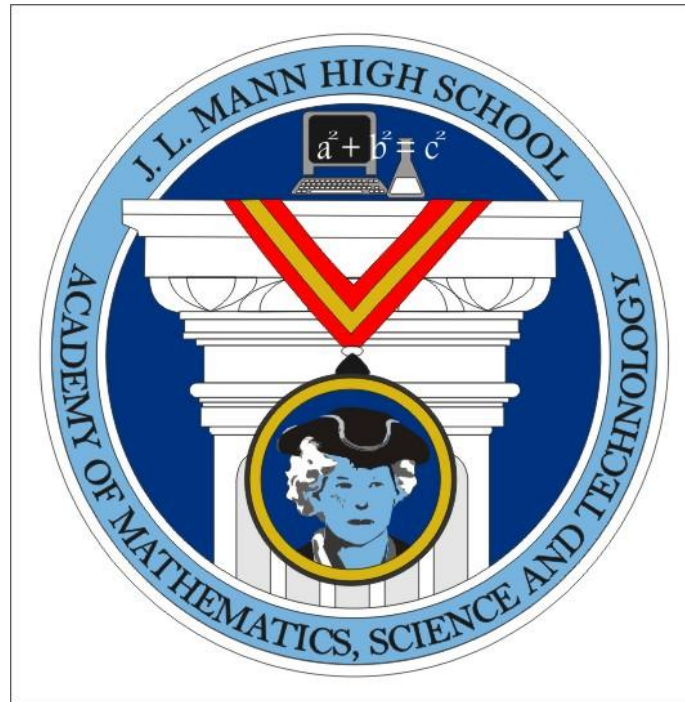

CLUBS & ORGANIZATIONS

Academic Team - Mr. Paul Keen

Meets weekly to provide an opportunity for students to participate in academic competitions. Annual events include the Scholastic Scoreboard.

Art Club "NAHS Chapter 692" - Mr. Steve Garner, Ms. April Fretwell, Mr. Adam Burgess

Meets weekly to generate enthusiasm for the visual arts at school. Yearly events include the Spring Art Exhibit, the Atlanta High Art Museum field trip, T-shirt fundraising, fundraising, and special projects for the school.

The J.L. Mann Book Club meets after school every 5-6 weeks to discuss a book chosen by the students. Several seniors in the National Honor Society lead the discussion.

Meets Thursday mornings at 8:00 a.m. to promote student fellowship and school spirit. Yearly events include activities and sports events.

Meets to learn how to tie flies, how to cast, read water, entomology, water safety and generally how to have a great time enticing fish with artificial flies!

French Club - Ms. Jennifer Cook

Meets at least once a month to give students the opportunity to further explore the French language and culture. It also has as its purpose the sharing of the Francophone language and culture with members of the community. Yearly events include field trips and an overseas trip to maximize the authenticity of the students' learning experience.

Future Business Leaders of America (FBLA) - Ms. Tena Brown

A new club is forming! FBLA will be participating in yearly competitions to develop leadership and marketable business skills.

History Club - Ms. Denise Borrelli

Meets to provide members with opportunities to explore history through social activities. This is a new club which is in the process of planning annual events.

Meets weekly to organize and carry out community, international and school-wide projects. Yearly events include fundraising for Miracle Hill, Operation Shoe Box and a Mann project.

Meets weekly on Thursdays to discuss issues around the world that are not often given media coverage. Yearly events include attending rallies for different invisible causes and raising awareness throughout the Mann community about these "invisible" issues.

Meets monthly to plan and organize activities to build school and community relationships. Yearly events include planned community-oriented activities: preparing Operation Christmas Child shoeboxes, collecting food for Greenville food banks, and sponsoring a reading day at a childcare/daycare facility for National Literacy Month.

Assists students in resolving conflicts with others. Upperclassmen can apply to be a mediator at the end of first semester each year.

Marching Band – Mr. Mike Retzer, Ms. Erin Bighia

The Marching Patriots rehearse twice a week; the band members include students from JL Mann and Beck Academy. Sections of the ensemble include horn line, drum line, front ensemble, and color guard. The band performs at pep rallies and football games. The group competes during October and November and marches in the Greenville Poinsettia Parade in December. All freshmen band students are required to participate in the marching band.

Math Team – Mr. Paul Keen

Meets periodically throughout the year to enhance student math skills in fun ways.

Mock Trial – Mr. Mark Davis

Students increase skills in listening, speaking, writing, reading, analyzing and synthesizing as they work trial scenarios. The group competes each year; competitions are sponsored by the SC Bar Law Related Education Division.

Model United Nations – Mr. Mark Davis

Students legislate in preparation for the Model UN Conference at Winthrop University, which consists of *General Assembly* and special committees centering on specific diplomatic areas. Students are exposed to world events and aspects of international relations.

Membership is open to juniors and seniors who demonstrate academic excellence, strong character and active community service. Yearly projects include Habitat for Humanity, tutoring, "Walk and Roll" for disabled children and fundraising events.

Patriot TV – Ms. Dipti Patel

Patriot TV allows students an opportunity to learn about broadcast journalism and video production, both on screen and behind the scenes. Students capture on film events ranging from Athletics and Fine Arts to Academics and other activities happening at Mann. They will produce shows highlighting these events.

Meets in class daily and after school to give students an opportunity to enhance map reading, rope bridge and marksmanship skills. Yearly events include Raider Challenges across the state.

The English for Speakers of Other Languages program provides assistance for J. L. Mann students, no matter what they are studying. The teachers working directly with this program also provide learning opportunities for all of our teachers to expand their understanding of just how diverse our society is becoming.

Extra Mann Power - All Teaching Staff

All teachers offer time weekly outside of class to tutor students.

Literacy Emphasis - All Teaching Staff

Each teaching department works hard to incorporate strengthening literacy skills in class assignments as part of Mann's literacy emphasis through our *High Schools That Work* program.

Magnet Program -- Ms. Debbie Howard, Coordinator

J. L. Mann Academy's Magnet Program is open to students who come to us through the application process and those who attend Mann as their homebase school. Mann offers an array of math, science and technology classes beyond the expected high school curriculum for students who see a future in one or more of these areas. The magnet academic track provides an opportunity for our students to follow a demanding curriculum and earn "Magnet Distinction" with special recognition at graduation.

SPECIAL PROGRAMS

Occupational Diploma Program - Ms. Heather Salter, Ms. Jennifer Brutosky

Qualifying students can graduate with a district occupational diploma instead of a traditional high school diploma.

Project Lead the Way - Mr. Tod Tucker

This is a growing program of courses for students interested in engineering. Engineering equipment and special computer programs allow for hands-on experiences for the students!

Advisor/Advisee Groups

All students meet throughout the school year to talk with their advisor about their progress in high school, what will happen after high school and character education.

Fine Arts Center

The Fine Arts Center offers students the opportunity to take any fine arts course they might be interested in. The teachers there are active in their field and can offer students the best training in music, dance and theater. Students who register for Fine Arts courses are bussed during the school day from Mann to the Fine Arts Center.

Golden Strip Career Center

The Golden Strip Career Center offers students the opportunity to take courses with job-skill driven curricula. Students can study anything from child care to computers; from mechanics to woodworking; from cosmetology to culinary arts. Students who register for Golden Strip courses are bussed during the school day from Mann to Golden Strip.

High Schools That Work

Mann became a *HSTW* site in 2006. This program emphasizes increased student achievement through key practices, such as literacy, extra help and advisor groups.

JROTC

The JROTC curriculum and activities challenge our students to elevate and hone self-confidence, self-discipline and leadership skills. It consists of formal classroom training supplemented by orientation trips to military activities and facilities in the area.

Mann Recycling Initiative - Ms. Allison Peake

A school-wide recycling initiative coordinated through Environmental Science classes in order to promote a more eco-friendly campus, reduce waste, and promote stewardship of the environment.

Patriot's Palate - Ms. Heather Salter, Ms. Jennifer Brutosky

Occupational Diploma students apply learned real-life cooking skills in this weekly event. The students cook samples of a product, give out the free samples, and take food orders every Wednesday. They fill the orders by cooking the food and delivering the product on Fridays. Patriot's Palate is a fundraiser for occupational student activities.

Patriot's Pantry - Ms. Heather Salter, Ms. Jennifer Brutosky, PTSA

Self-contained students learn real-life independent living skills while working in the PTSA School Store. Patriot's Pantry is a fundraiser for self-contained student activities.

Patriot Partners Mentoring Program - Ms. Allison Peake

Students meet weekly with a Mentor teacher, who provides support, academic and otherwise, for students who may need extra guidance in achieving their goals.

School Improvement Council

Meets monthly with faculty and community representatives to find ways to improve J. L. Mann, plan for and report on school-wide events.

ACTIVITIES

Black History Month - Mr. Josh Eversole

Held during the month of February each year, the students plan activities and an assembly in honor of Black History. The students begin working and planning in October.

Freshman Florida Trip - Mr. Red Cook, Mr. Hunter Ballenger

Held in the early spring of each year, this trip gives Freshmen time together to explore other cultures at Epcot in Disney World. They will also visit St. Augustine, Medieval Times and Universal Studios in Florida.

Held in June, this dignified ceremony marks the end of an important time in a young person's life and is planned by students and faculty.

Hispanic Heritage Month -Mr. Josh Eversole

Held from September 15 through October 15 each year, the students learn about Hispanic history, culture, and language. Students begin meeting in August to plan.

Held in the fall of each year, this week gives the students an opportunity to reflect on the importance of J. L. Mann in their lives as alumni return for a visit. The week culminates in a varsity football game and a dance.

Every Friday during the school year the students in Ms. Wylie's and Ms. Darnell's classes serve up a delicious lunch at the Arcadia Support Center and learn independent living skills as they serve. This award-winning program also provides some fundraising opportunities for the students.

Held in the late fall of each year, this contest showcases campus talent and beauty.

The Newspaper class allows students to learn about the publishing end of journalism. The student newspaper is published approximately twice a quarter, and is completely student-run.

An opportunity for students to work on a science or engineering-based project as part of a regional competition sponsored by the Intel Corporation.

Senior Project - Ms. Melissa Parton

Required for the Magnet Distinction award, J. L. Mann offers a Senior Project class to guide students in preparing and presenting a cumulative project their senior year. Project includes an idea of the student's design and some community involvement with a teacher's guidance. Senior Project participants do not have to be in the Magnet Distinction Academic program.

Special Olympics - Ms. Amy Wylie, Ms. Donna Darnell

Special Education students participate in skating, bowling, basketball skills, and track and field events throughout the school year.

Spirit Week - Mr. Josh Eversole

Held the week before the Mann vs. Greenville HS varsity football game every year, the students come together during this time to have fun and raise money for charity while building school spirit.

Talismann Day - Mr. Phillip Caston

Held in the late spring, this is a day for students to honor the senior class and enjoy some fun time signing yearbooks before final exams begin.

World History Trip - Mr. Red Cook

Meetings begin once a destination is chosen. Trips are taken in the month of June or during Spring Break. College credit is offered through the company for most trips. The program is dedicated to providing a hands-on learning environment in an overseas setting. Past destinations include over 30 different countries

World Class Partnership - Mr. Red Cook, Ms. Jennifer Cook

Meetings begin once exchange days are set to provide international partnerships with schools in other countries. The program is dedicated to providing cultural understanding through the formation of international partnerships. Students are placed in homes with families from other countries each year for approximately two weeks.
