## GUIDANCE REMINDERS:

- \* **College visits** for seniors must be approved by the principal one week prior to the date requested. Once they return, seniors must bring written verification from the college visited.
- \* **Parent information Sessions** are planned for ninth through eleventh grade students during the month of December. Look for more information in the mail.
- \* All **college applications** with a deadline of Jan. 1, 2005 must be turned into Ms. King by December 5, 2004.
- \* All **College announcements** about scholarships are listed on the College \$

web page of guidance after being published in the daily bulletin.

- \* **FEE WAIVERS**—In order to receive a fee waiver, you must qualify for free or reduced lunch by meeting federal income guidelines. Fee waivers may be used to pay the registration fee for one administration of the SAT and/or ACT, 4 college application fees and one CSS/Financial Aid Profile application. Fee waivers are open to all qualified students. See Guidance for additional info
- \* **SIRRINE SCHOLARSHIP**—ACT and SAT scores will be accepted. Applications will be available in March. Deadline March 15.

\* Check with guidance for dates and times of **financial aid workshops** offered in February. Sponsored by School District.

**FAFSA-Free Application For Federal Student Aid -2004-2005-** “This form is used to apply for federal student financial aid, including grants, loans, and work-study.
