http://greenville.schoollunchapp.com or from a link on the Washington Center website. In the past some parents have not completed the forms because their children were tube fed, had specialized diets or were homebound, but Title One funds are based on the percent of students at a school that qualify for assistance with meals, not the percent that actually eat the meals. If enough of our students are approved, we could become eligible for additional federal funds that would contribute tremendously to our program here at school. All of the children would benefit from the additional financial support, so I hope you will take a few minutes to complete the form, either hard copy or online, and turn it in to your child's teacher or submit it to Food Services. The information you provide will be confidential. Thank you for your help.
