



The History of the Evening Division at Furman University:

Undergraduate Evening Studies was established in September 1957 to meet the needs of those who wish to work toward an undergraduate degree and/or take courses which would be of value in professional or occupational advancement. Since then, Undergraduate Evening Studies (UES) has grown and evolved into a program serving nontraditional students who balance the challenges of work, family, and academics. Our goal is to provide our students with the highest quality instruction and student services possible. A challenging curriculum, led by experienced faculty, as well as experts in a variety of fields, provide students with foundational knowledge, the ability to think critically, communicate more effectively, and solve complex problems efficiently. Practical instruction, convenient class times, tailored advising and student services, a comprehensive curriculum and an abbreviated tuition structure are just a few ways we seek to serve our students.

Schedule: Fall: Block A Courses; August – October / Block B Courses; October – December

Block C Courses; August - December

Spring: Block A Courses; January – March / Block B Courses; March – May

Block C Courses; January - May

Summer: June - August (8 weeks)

When: Courses are typically offered Monday – Thursday and occasionally on Saturday.

Block A and B hybrid courses combine in-class meetings with online tools and meet one night per week

from 6-8:45p.m.

Block A and B non-hybrid courses are known as accelerated courses which meet twice weekly, from 6-

8:00p.m.

Courses are 3 credit hours each, with the exception of natural sciences, statistics, and foreign languages

which are typically 4 credit hours.

Class Locations: Furman University campus and the University Center of Greenville.

Degree, Majors, and Minors: The Bachelor of Liberal Arts (BLA) is offered in Accounting, Business Administration, and

Information Technology, or double major in any two of these majors. UES also offers

Environmental Studies as a minor.

Non-Degree Track: Post Baccalaureate Certificate: offered for Accounting or Data Analytics

Coursework is also offered towards CPA or CMA licensure, or to meet MBA school admission

requirements.

Tuition/Fees: Tuition: \$450 per credit hour (2017 – 2018 academic year)

Fees: \$35 application fee, \$150 enrollment deposit upon admission, \$10 annual parking fee

Financial Aid: Undergraduate students in the UES program file the FAFSA and UES Application for Financial Aid by June

for the following academic year and must hold at least 6 credit hours per semester to be eligible for

federal and state financial aid. Undergraduate students may be eligible for:

Admissions Requirements:

Undergraduate Applicants must:

- 1. Submit admission application and \$35 application fee
- 2. Official transcripts from all colleges and universities attended or proof of high school completion if college credits have not been completed.* Transcripts must reflect a minimum 2.5 cumulative GPA.
- *If fewer than 24 college credits, applicant must submit official SAT/ACT scores
- 3. Submit writing sample: 5 paragraph essay describing yourself, why you wish to attend Furman, and your goals for after you graduate.
- 4. Submit current resume
- 5. Attend admission interview

Post-Baccalaureate Certificate, Pre-CPA, Pre-CMA, Pre-MBA, non-degree:

- 1. Application and \$35 application fee
- 2. Official transcripts from all colleges and universities attended
- 3. Submit current resume
- 4. Attend admission interview

Transfer Credits:

A maximum of 64 credits may be transferred from a 2 year institution, 80 credits maximum from a 4 year institution.[†] Transfer credit evaluations are available upon submission of application, \$35 application fee, and transcripts.

To be considered for transfer, courses must be:

- 1. From a regionally accredited institution
- 2. The equivalent to Furman offerings or that would otherwise fit into the liberal arts curriculum
- 3. Completed with a satisfactory grade of C- or better

[†]A minimum of 45 credits must be completed at Furman, including 15 credits in the major, with the final 28 credits taken exclusively at Furman for the BLA undergraduate degree.

Undergraduate Evening Studies has three scholarships available exclusively for undergraduate evening students. The application deadline for these scholarships is 2 weeks prior to the start of the semester. Undergraduate students are eligible to apply after they have completed their first semester in the UES program.
