# New measures for student success in South Carolina



## **Dear Parents and Students:**

South Carolina is introducing new assessments this spring to measure academic performance for students across the state from the elementary grades through high school.

Three tests—ACT Aspire®, The ACT® Plus Writing, and ACT WorkKeys®—will help students prepare for future life success. The assessments form a connected system to monitor the educational progress of students from grades 3 through 8 and in grade 11. The tests are developed by ACT, the company best known for The ACT, the nation's leading college entrance exam.

# How do these assessments prepare students for the future?

When college and career readiness is measured at an early age, students have more time to make course adjustments throughout their academic years. In high school, test results can guide students as they make future education and career decisions and show them where improvements can increase their chances for success. The assessments give parents, students, educators, and administrators valuable information to help students reach their full potential.

# Why are the new assessments important?

- Parents, students, and educators will be able to track student progress using comparable measures from one grade to the next.
