The Department of Physics and Astronomy at the University of South Carolina will be leading eclipse events across campus to help visitors and their families safely observe the eclipse and learn about the science and history of total eclipses.

Rising seniors at your institution who are planning to be in Columbia, SC that day, are invited to join us for the eclipse viewing activities and a special reception in the Physics and Astronomy Department at 4:00 pm, after the eclipse. At this reception, visiting students will get a short (15 minute) introduction to the department and will then meet and talk with faculty members and graduate students.
