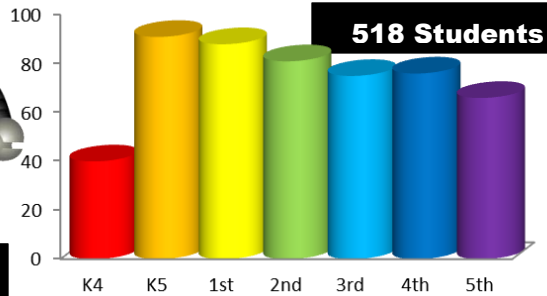
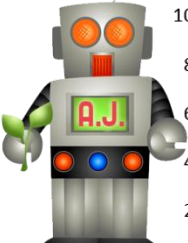

GROWING ENGINEERS

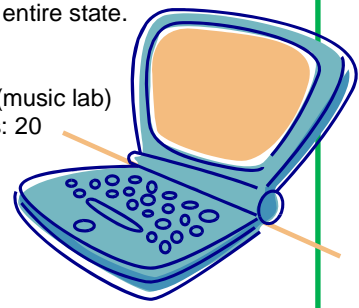
- Only elementary school in the state, and one of only a handful in the country, with a full engineering curriculum beginning in K4.

INNER CITY

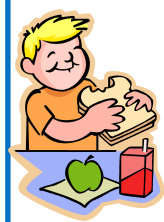
Co-located with the Salvation Army's Kroc Community Center in West Greenville. This distressed area is marked by high poverty, a high percentage of single parent households and the highest gang activity in the Upstate. More than a third of the student body is from this area.



CATCH

Coordinated Approach To Childhood Health (CATCH) program promotes healthy living through good nutrition and regular physical activity.

- Healthy Meals Served Daily: 625
- Free/Reduced Cost Meals: 87% (in area)
- Receiving free or reduced cost meals is a key indicator of childhood poverty.
