

2024-2025 SIC Report to the Community

Enoree Career Center is located in Northern Greenville County, south of Travelers Rest. The center was built in 1973, and a four-million-dollar renovation was completed during the 2005 school year. A new addition was completed in April of 2018 that houses classroom and lab space for the Machine Tool, Welding Technology, and Culinary Arts Programs. Additional renovations to create a new Mechatronics lab, expand the Automotive Technology shop, and improve the Building Construction lab took place during the summer of 2020.

Enoree Career Center serves students from four feeder high schools: Berea, Carolina, Travelers Rest, and Wade Hampton. Students from other high schools may attend the center for specialized career center courses not offered at neighboring centers.

The programs and courses offered at Enoree include Automotive Collision Repair, Automotive Technology, Building Construction, Cosmetology, Culinary Arts, Firefighting, Law Enforcement, Graphic Communications, Machine Tool Technology, Mechatronics, and Welding Technology. Additionally, Enoree Career Center offers a Career Academy program for ninth-grade students who want to learn more about career options and learning opportunities at the career centers.

Other highlights and achievements of our programs this year include the following:

- Our enrollment continues to grow, with 458 student enrolled in our programs for the 2024-2025 school year. In addition, 121 Career Exploratory offers were made, allowing students to try multiple program offerings.
- Enoree's Career Academy served 121 students from our feeder high schools and has created a feeder pattern into our two-year programs of over 50%. There is a growth from 30% the prior year.
- Enoree and Greenville Technical College are working together to offer dual credit opportunities in Culinary Arts and Mechatronics for the 2024-2025 school year.
- Enoree students have a goal of earning at least 3 industry certifications, at the time of this report final numbers are not available.
- Fire Fighting student Brendan Davis was named Enoree's Student of the Year and will be recognized at the Salute to Education Banquet in late May.
- 178 students are program Completers, and the seniors will be recognized at their high school graduation ceremony and a Completer Awards Ceremony on May 2 at Trailblazer Park.
- Ronardo Bowser, Law Enforcement Instructor, is the 2025 - 2026 Enoree Teacher of the Year.

Our school-wide motto of "Let's Get to Work!" remains the focus as we continue to provide rigorous instruction and work-based experiences for our students. This focus provides students with advantages in their next steps, including entering the workforce, military, or continuing their education in a post-secondary environment.
