

2020-2021 Report to the Community

Enoree Career Center is located in Northern Greenville County, south of Travelers Rest. The center was built in 1973, and a four-million-dollar renovation was completed during the 2005 school year. A new addition was completed in April of 2018 and houses classroom and lab space for the Machine Tool, Welding Technology, and Culinary Arts Programs. Additional renovations to create a new Mechatronics lab, expand the Automotive Technology shop, and improve to the Building Construction lab took place during the summer of 2020.

Enoree Career Center serves students from four feeder high schools: Berea, Carolina, Travelers Rest, and Wade Hampton. Students from other high schools may elect to attend the center for specialized career center courses not offered at neighboring centers.

The programs and courses offered at Enoree include Automotive Collision Repair, Automotive Technology, Building Construction, Cosmetology, Culinary Arts, Firefighting, Law Enforcement, Graphic Communications, Machine Tool Technology, Mechatronics, and Welding Technology. Additionally, Enoree Career Center offers a Career Academy program for ninth grade students who want to learn more about career options and learning opportunities at the career centers.

Other highlights and achievements of our programs include:

- The total enrollment continues to grow, with over 300 new students projected to be enrolled in 2021-2022 and 136 students returning to complete their program, for a total of over 430 students.
- Enoree's Career Academy serves over 100 ninth-grade students from Travelers Rest, Berea, and Wade Hampton High Schools.
- Enoree and Greenville Technical College worked together to help Mechatronics students earn dual credit in the new program.
- Machine Tool again earned a Gene Haas Foundation grant for student scholarships and teacher training.
- Even with the changing schedules throughout this school year, Enoree students were able to earn over 550 industry certifications, with the possibility of more to be added in the summer.
- Daniela Alvarez was elected as a SkillsUSA state officer and will represent our school and state throughout the 2020-21 school year.
- 54 new members were inducted into the National Technical Honor Society.
- Cosmetology student Malaijah Williams was named as Enoree's Student of the Year and will be recognized at the Salute to Education Banquet in late May.
- Machine Tool student Daniela Alvarez was named the Greenville Regional Technology Champion of the Year and will be recognized at the Education and Business Summit in June 2021.
- 102 students are program Completers, and the seniors will be recognized at their high school graduation ceremony.
- Several employees earned recognition: Katie Ward, WYFF Golden Apple Award Winner, Mark Crain, Secondary Emerging Teacher of the Year, Tavis Lydic, Enoree Teacher of the Year, Holly Bell, ProStart Educator of Excellence.

Even in the midst of challenges brought on by the pandemic, our school-wide motto of "Let's Get to Work!" remains the focus as we to provide instruction and work-based experiences that provide students with advantages in their next steps, including entering the work-force, the military, and continuing their education in a post-secondary environment.
