

Fisher Dress Code 2019-20

The following criteria will serve as the expected dress code for 2019-20 students attending Dr. Phinnize J Fisher Middle School.

Tops:

- Solid color, collared shirt (I.e. polo style, rugby style, dress shirt)
- Solid color sweaters, cardigans, sweater vests
- Solid color crew neck sweatshirts
- Hooded sweatshirts must follow Fisher dress code if worn in school. Hoods will be expected to be dropped upon entry and remain down. Students will be asked to remove the sweatshirt if the hood is up or does not meet Fisher dress code.
- Fisher Spirit Wear; T-Shirts, Long Sleeve T-Shirts, crew neck sweatshirts, hooded sweatshirts
- Students may wear another Greenville County Schools spirit wear/jersey if they participate in an activity for that school
- Dresses must be of a solid color
- No sleeveless shirts

Bottoms:

- No denim; Colored denim pants are NOT dress code
- Khaki, Navy, Black Pants, Shorts, Skirts
- All pants must have a seam and pockets; Yoga pants and leggings are not code
- No athletic shorts, joggers, sweatpants, warm-up pants, wind pants, etc. unless it's a dress down day or other special event (ReWa 5K, Field & STEAM)
- Pants are to remain pulled up so as not to expose undergarments
- Shorts should be at a modest length (ID length above knee based on GCSD)
- Pants and shorts should not have holes, tears, or factory produced exposed worn threading
- On jeans/dress down day, holes or tears must be at the knee or below and anything above that must have an added layer of clothing underneath

Shoes:

- Proper shoes must be worn at all times
- No wheeled shoes
- No house shoes or slippers unless it's a pre-approved theme day

Jackets & Coats:

- Students may wear whatever jacket or coat they wish to Fisher but it must meet Fisher Dress Code in order to remain on once in the building, which is climate controlled.
- Hooded Sweatshirts often serve as a student's jacket; The same expectations apply.
