

STUDENT ID BADGES – (Enforcement begins August 30, 2018)

For safety and identification, students must wear the school-issued ID badge and lanyard (issued the current school year from the home high school) when on school grounds. This ID must be clearly visible at all times (cannot be inside jacket or shirt). For safety purposes, students in shop classes (welding, carpentry, automotive, animal science, and career rotation) will follow the teacher's instructions related to wearing student IDs in the shop area.

Wearing another person's ID will result in ISS. If a student does not bring the ID badge to school, a temporary ID badge must be obtained before class begins. The first temporary ID badge will be free; subsequent temporary ID badges will cost \$0.50. After five temporary ID badges have been issued, a student will be placed in ISS until a new ID badge has been purchased from the home school. Failure to have an ID badge when class starts will cause the student to be placed in ISS at any time during the day that the offense is discovered. Range of consequences: Parent notification, detention, ISS, and suspension.

OUTSIDE FOOD/DRINKS – (Enforcement begins immediately)

Upon entering the building, students must store all food and drink items away until break. Students may bring food into the school; however, it may only be consumed during break time. No food should be consumed during instructional time. Tardy arrival due to stopping for food/drinks at area convenience stores, fast food restaurants, and other locations will result in disciplinary action including possible revocation of driving privileges.

HATS – (Enforcement begins immediately)

Hats may not be worn in the building. Students in shop classes may wear hats in the shop area only as instructed by their teacher for safety/sanitary reasons.

STUDENT PERSONAL ELECTRONIC DEVICES-“BRING YOUR OWN DEVICE” POLICY – (Enforcement begins immediately)

Golden Strip Career Center has adopted a Bring Your Own Device (BYOD) policy for the 2018-2019 school year. This policy will allow students to bring many of their own technology devices to school for use in our classrooms. We are incorporating the use of such items as laptops, iPads, netbooks and cell phones with browsing capabilities for educational purposes only. Similar to other personally owned items, the district is not liable for the loss, damage, misuse, or theft of personally owned devices brought to school.

This notification is to inform and guide you through this opportunity. Please note that students are never required to bring in outside technology to school. All students will continue to be able to utilize our school equipment. No student will be left out of the instructional process. Golden Strip Career Center will not be responsible for any financial obligations resulting from standard messaging or data charges incurred by students who choose to bring their own device.

Expectations:

- Students will only use appropriate technology at their teachers' discretion.
- Students will only use appropriate educational applications on their device (i.e. not games and/or non-school related tasks and functions).
- Students are not to call, text message, email, or electronically communicate with others from their personal device, including other students, parents, guardians, friends, and family during the school day unless directed by their teacher or during designated times (i.e. outside break area).
- Students will not use outlets (i.e., computers or wall) to charge their device.

Reinforcement:

- Students utilizing this opportunity to its fullest capacity within school expectations will find numerous benefits to instruction, resources, completion of assignments and personal organization.
- Students not following expectations for use of personal devices will face school disciplinary measures and lose the privilege to utilize personal devices in school for an appropriate period of time to be determined by the school principal.

RESPONSIBLE STUDENT USE OF PERSONALLY OWNED DEVICES

Golden Strip Career Center approves this policy in order to maintain a safe and secure environment for students and employees. A personally owned device shall include all existing and emerging technology devices that can take photographs; record audio or video; input text; upload and download media; and transmit or receive messages or images. Examples of a personally owned device include but are not limited to: MP3 players and iPods; iPads, Nooks, Kindle and other tablets; laptop and netbook computers; personal digital assistants (PDAs), cell phones and smart phones such as iPhone, or Droid, as well as any device with similar capabilities. Educational purposes include classroom activities, career development, communication with experts, homework and limited high quality self-discovery activities. Students are expected to act responsibly and thoughtfully when using technology resources. Students bear the burden of responsibility to inquire with school administrators and/or teachers when they are unsure of the permissibility of a particular use of technology prior to engaging in the use.

Inappropriate communication includes, but is not limited to, the following:

- obscene, profane, lewd, vulgar, rude, inflammatory, threatening, or disrespectful language or images typed, posted, or spoken by students;
- information that could cause damage to an individual or the school community or create the danger of disruption of the academic environment;
- personal attacks, including prejudicial or discriminatory attacks;
- harassment (persistently acting in a manner that distresses or annoys another person) or stalking of others;
- knowingly or recklessly posting false or defamatory information about a person or organization;
- communication that promotes the destruction of property, including the acquisition or creation of weapons or other destructive devices.

If a student is told to stop sending communications, that student must cease the activity immediately. Examples of an unacceptable device in this policy shall include but are not limited to gaming devices or consoles, laser pointers, modems or routers, and televisions. Use of personally owned devices is permitted during instructional time for educational purposes only as approved by the teacher.

Golden Strip Career Center shall not be liable for the loss, damage, misuse, or theft of any personally owned device brought to school. We reserve the right to monitor, inspect, copy, and review a personally owned device or file when administration has a reasonable suspicion that a violation has occurred. Students must be aware of appropriateness of communications when using district or personally owned devices. Inappropriate communication is prohibited in any public messages, private messages, and material posted online by students.

Students may not utilize any technology to harass, threaten, demean, humiliate, intimidate, embarrass, or annoy their classmates or others in their community. This is unacceptable student behavior known as cyberbullying and will not be tolerated. Any cyberbullying that is determined to disrupt the safety and/or well-being of the school is subject to disciplinary and/or legal action.

Use of personally owned devices in locker rooms, restrooms, and administrative offices is expressly prohibited. Students are not permitted to use any electronic device to record audio or video media or take pictures of any student or staff member without their permission. The distribution of any unauthorized media may result in discipline, including but not limited to, suspension, criminal charges, and expulsion.

All students shall review this policy and the Responsible Use Policy before utilizing any school and/or personally owned devices. Golden Strip Career Center reserves the right to restrict student use of district owned technologies and personally owned devices on school property or at school sponsored events.

Cell phone or other use of personal devices outside of break or without teacher's prior approval will result in disciplinary action which may include consequences for refusing to obey and/or disturbing school.
