## Parent and Family Engagement Policy 2021-2022

To implement an effective Parent and Family Engagement Policy and plan to support students' academic success, Hollis Academy will do the following:

  with other District officials as appropriate or required, and maintain a file of parental

comments and concerns and their dispositions at appropriate local school and District levels as required by District or Title I procedures.

- D. Coordinate and integrate parent engagement strategies with parent engagement strategies under other programs such as Head Start, Parents as Teachers program, Home Instruction Programs for Preschool Youngsters, and State-run preschool programs.

- Inform parents and guardians through various communications, such as flyers, weekly updates, phone calls, about the school, its programs, and their child's academic progress.
- Invite parents and guardians to participate in and attend all programs being offered;
- Seek parental input by asking them to serve on committees that make decisions about school programs.

# G. The school will make accommodations to support parent and family engagement through the following:

- Encourage parent and family engagement by paying reasonable and necessary expenses associated with food, transportation, and childcare costs to enable participation.
- Communications translated to assist non-English speaking families and parents with disabilities
- Arrange school, parent meetings and conferences at a variety of times and days to maximize parental engagement and program.
