## Counselor's Corner — Empathy

"Empathy" has been a big focus at LFE this month. **Empathy** is the ability to feel or understand what another person is feeling. There are many ways we can help build our children's ability to show empathy.

- Model empathy! Use everyday opportunities to demonstrate empathy in front of your children.
- Talk about how other people might be having a hard day because something difficult is happening in their lives and this can affect how kindly they speak to people.
- When reading a book or watching a movie with your children, ask them what feelings different characters are experiencing and why the characters are experiencing those emotions.
- When you're at stores, restaurants or spending time with family, point out the

facial expressions, body language, or tone of voice of people around you. Based on their observations, ask your children what others might be feeling and why.

When riding in the car, sitting at the dinner table, or tucking your kids in bed at night, asking them consider questions such as: What made you smile today? What was hard about today? How did you feel when that happened? (excited, disappointed, frustrated, nervous, happy?) How do you think the other person might have felt? How did you or someone else show empathy today?

We may think our children already know everything about emotions and how to express them appropriately. However, we need to help build our children's emotional vocabulary in everyday life situations and continually improve. Every person



experiences the same emotions at different times and in various situations. We may not have the same feelings about the same event, but we can practice empathy for those around us. The more we normalize conversations involving emotions, the better our children will become at demonstrating for empathy others.
