State Testing Begins This Month

This year, students in third, fourth, and fifth grades in South Carolina will take the SC College-and-Career Ready Assessment (SC READY). Students in those grades will take ELA (writing and reading) and mathematics tests. Additionally, students in fourth and fifth grades will take SC Palmetto Assessments of State Standards (SCPASS) science and social studies tests. In addition to the letters you received, you may

view our testing calendar by visiting our school website. This test is untimed. This test is important to our students and school. We need to make sure that we provide the best testing environment possible so our kids do well on this test. No visitors are allowed in the building for any grade (even if you are not a testing grade). We will allow parents to eat with their child on the days their child is NOT testing.



Counselor's Corner—Emotional Awareness

Why is emotional awareness important for children? Children who are able to identify how they feel are often better able to communicate their needs. They are also more likely to understand the feelings of their friends, classmates, and the grown-ups in their lives. This builds empathy, a crucial life skill. Becoming comfortable with their feelings is important as children face new challenges and learn to manage their changing emotions.

Research shown has that emotional intelligence or EQ "predicts over 54% of the variation in success (relationships, effectiveness, health, quality of life)." Additional data concludes that "young people with high EQ earn higher grades, stay in school, and make healthier choices (Lisa Psychology Today). Firestone. By talking about emotional awareness with your children, you can help them to identify specific feeling words, learn Children who are able to identify how they feel are often better able to communicate their needs.

definitions of new feeling words, recognize feelings in self and others, and understand that all feelings are okay.

Helping your child build emotional awareness:

There are simple things you can do at home to help your child learn more about emotions. Try some of these ideas:

- Ask your child how he/she is feeling. List some feeling words to choose from.
- Share how you are feeling. Be specific.
- Play feelings charades. Show your feelings on your face and body.
- Read stories with your child and talk about how the characters are feeling.

You can also try some of these books about feelings:

- The Way I Feel by Janan Cain
- In My Heart by Jo Witek
- How Are You Peeling? by Saxton Freymann
- When Sophie Gets Angry by Molly Bang

If you would like for your child to borrow books to read over the summer, encourage your child to stop by the media center for a parent permission form.

22nd. All students do need to be accompanied by an adult.
