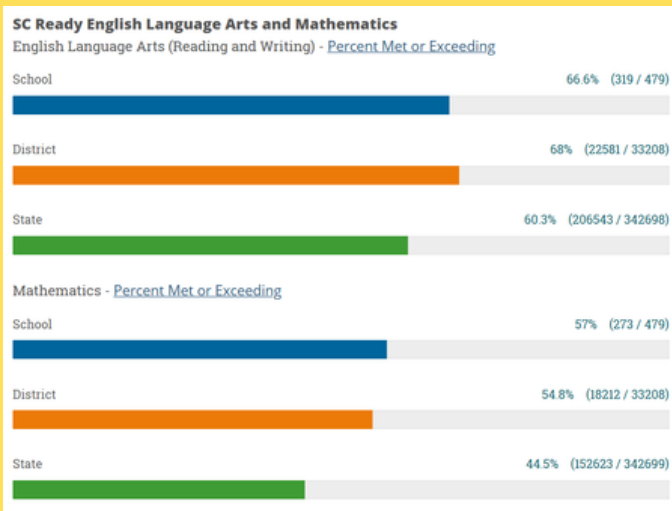

The Student Improvement Council (SIC) is a state-mandated group of parents, staff, and community members who work collaboratively to enhance student experiences and support academic success. Through initiatives such as grant writing, event planning, and securing donations, the SIC plays an active role in meeting the evolving needs of our school community.

During Lunch & Learn events, families gained practical, grade-level strategies to support their child's math growth at home, while school interventionists shared effective at-home reading practices to strengthen student learning.

Throughout the academic year, 226 books were gifted to students, teachers, and community members—helping to promote literacy and a love of reading beyond the classroom.

During Read Across America Week, 45 community members and parents volunteered their time to read with students, fostering meaningful connections and inspiring a lifelong love of reading.

At both the Fall and Spring Showcases, students celebrated their growth by sharing academic achievements and creative work with families, teachers, and the broader school community.
