PERFORMANCE GOALS

Student Achievement

- By 2029, the percentage of students scoring Meets Expectations and Exceeds Expectations on SC READY Math will increase from 41% in 2022–23 to 64% in 2028–29.
- By 2029, the percentage of students scoring Meets Expectations and Exceeds Expectations on SC READY ELA will increase from 65.7% in 2022–23 to 81% in 2028–29.

Teacher/Administrative Quality

- 100% of classroom teacher positions will be filled on the first day of school by highly qualified educators (through 2029).
- Reduce teacher turnover by 0.5 percentage points annually through 2029.

School Climate

- Ensure an environment where positive relationships, consistent behavior expectations, consequences, and interventions foster healthy student and adult interactions, resulting in, by 2029, a 10-point decrease in the percentage of students receiving more than one incident referral in a single school year
- By 2029, reduce the percentage of students who are chronically absent* by 10 points.
- Increase connection between families and school personnel, and ensure engagement in the academic success of children, as measured in a composite of data on parent/teacher conferences, volunteer hours, and Backpack check-ins, such that by 2029, the baseline engagement measured will increase by 10-percentage points.
