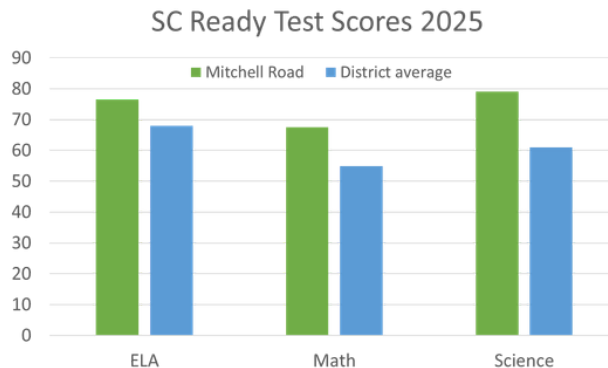
SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT PLAN GOALS
