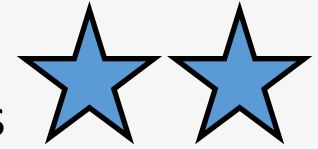

Options to Ensure Student Success



SCHOOL PROGRAMS IN PLACE TO HELP STUDENTS SUCCEED

Take Two is a re-do program that allows student's to retake major assessments after a failing grade is earned. Retaking the assessment is preceded by a re-teaching session by the classroom teacher.

Flex Time provides students with 30 extra minutes in every academic class each week on a rotating basis.

Special Education Resources

English and Math Inclusion is offered in each grade level to provide special education services in the general education classroom.

Read 180 and System 44 are two reading intervention services designed for students below grade level to regain critical reading skills.

Targeted Academic Assistance Program: 90 minutes of afterschool tutoring and mentorship provided by certified teachers.

IXL: English, Math, and Science IXL subscriptions are used by teachers to scaffold lessons.

Language! Live is a digital, teacher-led literacy program designed to help struggling readers by providing instruction and practice in foundational and advanced literacy skills.

The **STAR Program** is designed for off grade level students in 7th grade to regain their retained year.

The **iLit Program** for English Language Learners is designed to build language and literacy skills in reading, speaking, listening, and writing.

RESOURCES TO USE IF A STUDENT *IS NOT SUCCEEDING* ACADEMICALLY, SOCIALLY, OR EMOTIONALLY

Evaluation Planning Meetings are available to parents/guardians for formal evaluation which may or may not result in the introduction of Special Education Services or a 504 Accommodation Plan.

Teacher Tutoring is available before or after school to review material learned in class. Students should schedule a time with their teacher in advance.

Peer Tutoring may be set up by a school counselor to provide additional academic assistance. Students meet with an assigned peer tutor one day per week in the Media Center.

A **parent conference** can be set up by a school counselor to discuss classroom performance, behavior, and to formulate ways to get your student back on track.

The **School Counseling Department** provides students with a range of services including academics, personal/social, and career development.

A **mental health counselor** from Greer Mental Health is available to provide counseling to students. A student must be referred to the mental health counselor by a school counselor.

Through a partnership with **Mentor Greenville**, students may be paired with an adult mentor to have lunch one day per week.

RESOURCES TO USE IF A STUDENT *IS SUCCEEDING* ACADEMICALLY, SOCIALLY, OR EMOTIONALLY

Honor Societies: National Junior Honor Society, National Junior Beta Club, and National Junior Art Honor Society are offered for students who are succeeding academically and meet membership requirements.

Advanced courses are available at all grade levels including: Math 6/7/8, Math 6/7, Math 7/8, Gifted and Talented English, Algebra 1 Honors, Geometry Honors, English 1 Honors, Spanish 1 CP, Art 1 CP, Cyber Citizenship, Virtual PE, Fundamentals of Computing, Personal Finance, Graphic Art and Design, as well as, high school credit offerings in all music programs.

Peer Tutors have the opportunity to give back to their school by helping other students who may need additional academic assistance.
