

Don't forget to vote in the special election on I Tuesday, December 14, to elect our representative for the District 21 SC House seat (most Oakview families are in District 21). You can vote on December 14, regardless of whether or not you voted in the previous primary and runoff elections. If you care about the future of public education in South Carolina, and are concerned about current and future budget cuts, then please come out to vote on December 14! The candidates are:

Susan Scarborough Smith: A former television reporter who is now a small business owner in Taylors. Smith said she's running because she is disappointed in how the legislature has handled public school funding. Smith said she will bring a fresh approach and perspective to Columbia with a strong focus on public education and economic development in the Upstate.

Phyllis Henderson: Served one term on the Greenville County Council. Henderson said she would fight increased government spending and make government more accountable and transparent.

Did you know that South Carolina ranks last in the United States when it comes to women in the state legislature? There are no women in the state senate and only sixteen in the House of Representatives. Women make up just ten percent of state legislators. It is very unique that the two candidates for this seat are both women!)


Reflections
