Year in Review

I wish to extend a sincere thanks to faculty/staff members, parents, community members, and other district employees who have contributed so much to make the 2012-2013 school year a tremendous success! Oakview Elementary School continues to set itself apart as a leader in the district, state, and nation as we work together for student success. The school received its 12th consecutive Palmetto Gold Award, earned a grade of "A" on its state report card, and was recognized by the state with a second Palmetto Gold Award for "closing the achievement gap" for students who historically underachieve on state tests. The faculty, staff, and PTA worked together to organize events such as Family Math, Science, and Technology Night and the Hootenanny, to name just two. PTA provided direct support for instruction through the purchase of iPads and leveled readers! Oakview was recognized as a Safe Kids Schools for the 8th consecutive year! These accomplishments could only happen through the joint efforts of everyone at the school! Thank you ALL!

Oakview Receives Healthy School Award

Congratulations to Oakview Elementary School! LiveWell Greenville has recognized Oakview as a school which is "making a healthy choice an easy choice" for students. As a 2013 award recipient, the school received \$250, a plaque, and a banner. The funds will be applied toward expansion of the school's health and wellness initiatives and the banner will hang in the school's cafeteria.

Oakview proudly accepts this honor from LiveWell Greenville as a reflection of its commitment to health and wellness. Since the enactment of state legislation in 2005, Oakview has broadened its efforts to improve student health. A new cafeteria menu, daily fitness walks, filtered water "Hydration Stations" in the cafeteria, "Five Minute Fitness" to start each day, numerous before and after school clubs, student participation in local fun run marathons, and a Health and Wellness Night are just a few examples to demonstrate Oakview's commitment to improved student health.
