

School Is Still the Safest Place to Be

Even with national headlines about tragedies occurring on school campuses, the data is clear that **schools are still the safest place for children** during the day. At Oakview, we take seriously our obligation to provide a safe school environment for the children and adults on campus. A few components of the school's safety measures include:

16 surveillance cameras and DVR system

Key pad door locks on all exterior doors

Visitor and volunteer computer check in system

Volunteer background checks against the national sex offender registry

A comprehensive school safety plan

Regular drills for fire, lock down, earthquake, tornado, etc.

Digital radios (walkie-talkies) used daily on campus

School phone message system to alert families

This short list does not include other school safety initiatives in place to address internet use, bullying, and other student related matters. However, it does provide examples of our ongoing effort to promote safety. Thank you for your support as we partner in this effort.

Welcome Back!

We are Oakview's School Counselors, and we hope you and your children have had a smooth start to the school year. An important question we plan to address this year is "How are our students different as a result of what our School Counselors do?" So here is an overview of what we do as School Counselors at Oakview Elementary.

Students and Parents:

- Classroom Guidance We go to each classroom once a month and teach a lesson on Character Education.
- Individual Counseling We meet individually with students through parent, student, or teacher requests.
- Small Group Counseling We hold
 Small Groups on topics such as Friend ship, Changing Families, Study Skills,
 and Grief. Other groups will be held for
 any additional concerns that may arise.
 Parental approval is required.

Parent Conferences – We are available to meet for Parent Conferences and also during Teacher Conferences.

Community:

- "Fill-a-Backpack" Program This is a time when parents can purchase various school items to give to children who do not have their necessary school supplies.
- "Books for the Homeless" Duringour School Book Fairs, we have "Books

for the Homeless." Parents can purchase or donate new books, and students can donate their extra change. All books go to children in local homeless shelters.

"Giving Tree" - At Christmas, we partner with the Salvation Army to help make the holidays brighter for local children.

We serve as the School Test Coordinators for ITBS in the fall for second graders and PASS in the spring for third-fifth graders.


"Life is a Highway – We are on the Road to Success!"

Welcome to the 2012-2-13 school year! Our theme is "Life is a Highway – We are on the Road to Success!" In our Guidance Program we use words from the LifeSkills Program which reinforces good behaviors and traits that all students should exhibit. Having a common language throughout the school will help create a positive and consistent school environment. It is important that these

LifeSkills are taught to all students, so the words will be displayed in all of the classrooms. By using these words consistently as a school, our students will begin to understand that these are the skills that will help them to be successful in life.

Instead of referring to the character traits as LifeSkills, we are calling them "Life Signs for Success." We will recognize students who have consistently shown the Life Sign that we discussed in each month's classroom guidance lesson. For this award, our teachers will choose 2-4 students each month, and they will be awarded with a certificate and also be recognized on the morning news, a bulletin board, and in the local newspaper.

We are excited about our program, and we know that this will encourage our students to make good choices in their behavior as they continue on their road to success!
