Red Ribbon Week is being celebrated October 21-25. This year's theme is "A Healthy Me is Drug Free." School-wide activities will occur during this week to spread awareness of drug and violence prevention. Students can participate throughout Red Ribbon Week in the following spirit days:

The week has since evolved into a country-wide week dedicated to showing the intolerance for drugs in our schools, work places, and communities.
