





 - Social Studies 3 (US History, ½ Government,
 ½ Economics, Other Social Studies)
 - Fine Arts 1
 - PE 1
 - Academic Elective 1 (anything additional from English, Math, Science, Social Studies or Foreign Language)



The "BIG" Picture for College Admissions


- Grades/GPA/Rank
- Schedule handling course load and extracurricular (Is the student taking rigorous courses to prepare for college?)
- SAT or ACT scores
- Extra-curricular activities
- Volunteer Work





Additional College Requirements

- Clemson University requires 3 units of the same foreign language.
- College of Charleston requires 3 units of foreign language – can be from 2 different languages
- Students looking at out of state institutions should check with that institution on what it requires.



- Arrangements must be made with the Attendance Office 24 hours prior to the visit.
- Procedures are outlined the Student/Parent Handbook.






PSAT

- Given to <u>ALL</u> 10th graders (Paid by South Carolina)
- 11th graders <u>MUST</u> pay to take the test (\$14.83)
 - It is recommended that Juniors take the test
 - Qualifies Juniors for National Merit Scholarships
 - Student will register & pay test fee through Mrs. Rogers in fall or through the Prepayment Form in August.
- Test results & test booklets are given to students in December before the Winter Break.






- The SAT is made up of 3 parts:
 - Critical Reading (200-800)
 - Mathematics (200-800)
 - Writing (200-800)
- Register through College Board www.collegeboard.org
- RHS needs to receive student's scores in order to recommend for scholarships (Palmetto Fellows, Local Scholarships etc.) - RHS code – 410951
- Recommendation is to take spring of Junior year.
- Students on Free/Reduced Lunch should see their Counselor for a Fee Wavier.





ACT

- Tests 5 areas English, Math, Reading, Science & Writing
- Writing section is optional TAKE IT!
- Individual Scores for each section (0-36)
- Composite Score overall score –average of English, Math, Reading & Science (writing not included)
- Register through ACT www.act.org
- RHS needs to receive student's scores in order to recommend for scholarships (Palmetto Fellows, Local Scholarships, etc.) - - RHS code – 410951
- Students on Free/Reduced Lunch should see their Counselor for a Fee Wavier.



Comparison of ACT vs SAT

- 3 hours, 25 minutes
- 4 sections (English, Math, Reading, Science, Writing (optional))
- Composite score 1-36 based on average of 4 sections
- No penalties for incorrect answers
- \$33 ACT only / \$48 plus Writing


<u>SAT</u>

- 3 hours, 45 minutes
- 10 sections (3 critical reading, 3 math, 3 writing (including essay))
- Aggregate score 600-2400 base on 3 scores
- Penalties for wrong answers
- \$49 for all 3 sections

PALMETTO FELLOWS SCHOLARSHIP

- Up to \$6,700
 - Enhancements to the scholarship are also available.
 - Please see the website (<u>http://www.che.sc.gov</u>) for specific details
- Four-year college in SC
- Application completed in December or June of senior year with Counselor
- Renewable





PALMETTO FELLOWS SCHOLARSHIP

- Early awards December deadline
 - Eligible one of two ways:
 - 1. 1200 on SAT (critical reading & math)/27 on ACT (composite)
 - 3.5 GPA at end of junior year
 - Top 6% of class at end of sophomore or junior year
 - 2. 1400 on SAT (critical reading & math)/32 on ACT (composite)
 - 4.0 GPA at end of junior year

Final awards – June deadline

- Eligible one of two ways:
 - 1. 1200 on SAT (critical reading & math)/27 on ACT (composite)
 - 3.5 GPA at end of senior year
 - Top 6% of class at end of sophomore , junior or senior year
 - 2. 1400 on SAT (critical reading & math)/32 on ACT (composite)
 - 4.0 GPA at end of senior year




LIFE SCHOLARSHIP

- Up to \$5,000
 - Enhancements to the scholarship are also available.
 - Please see the website (<u>http://www.che.sc.gov</u>) for specific details
- Must meet two (2) of the following requirements:
 - 1100 on SAT (critical reading & math)/24 on ACT (composite)
 - 3.0 GPA upon graduation
 - Top 30% of graduating class
- Four or two-year college in SC
- No Application to complete The Financial Aid Office will automatically take care of this for the student
- Renewable



SC HOPE SCHOLARSHIP


- \$2,650
- 3.0 GPA upon graduation
- Four-year college in SC
- For students who do not qualify for Palmetto or LIFE
- Non-renewable





LOTTERY TUITION ASSISTANCE

- Two-year technical college
- Amount varies according to available funds
- Must file FAFSA






2015-2016 Course Registration

- Students will receive their **RED** Folder during their IGP/Academic Plan Conference.

- Students will receive a copy of their course requests in April 2015. Parents & students should sign one copy and return to the school.
- Students wishing to apply to attend Bonds Career Center should complete their application online. (www.greenville.k12.sc.us/bonds)



Important Dates


- January 23-30 = Teachers place course recommendations into computer
- February 2 March 17 = Individual Graduation Plan (IGP) & Academic Plan Conference with Underclassmen & Parents.
 - Override Forms & Senior Early Dismissal Forms available in the Counseling Office.
- March 19= Last day for Teachers to sign Overrides
- March 20= Junior & Senior Early Dismissal Forms DUE to Counseling Office & Override Forms DUE to the Counseling Office by 4 PM!
- **April 14** = Students receive copy of course request
- April 16 = Students return 1 copy of course requests



What is in the **RED** Folder?

- Information Sheet SC State Diploma requirements, what SC Colleges are looking for on the transcript, important dates for registration.
- <u>Copy of student's transcript</u> This copy reflects through summer 2014, an updated transcript will be distributed through Advisor/Advisee in February 2015
- <u>Graduation Progress Sheet</u> outlines credits towards the diploma.
- Four-Year Plan Freshmen only
- Student Parent Portal Letter









Override Procedures


Override Form is picked up from the Counseling office. A separate form is required for each course.

- The legal guardian and student's current teacher <u>MUST</u> discuss the teacher's recommendation in person, on the phone, or by email. (All email addresses and classroom phone numbers for the RHS teachers are posted on the faculty page of the RHS website.)
- The student takes the Override Form to the teacher (by March 19) for his/her signature. The teacher's signature verifies that a discussion has occurred with the legal guardian. It does not verify that the teacher agrees with the family's decision to override the recommended course.
- The <u>legal guardian</u> returns the Override Form to the Counseling office and <u>signs the form in the presence of</u> <u>the Counseling staff</u> no later than 4PM on Friday, March 20, 2015! Forms delivered by a student will <u>NOT</u> be accepted.



Early Dismissal for Seniors

- Required for less than 7 class periods
- Must be classified as a senior
- Must be enrolled in courses needed for SC Diploma
- Must be scheduled for minimum of 4 class periods
- Must complete Early Dismissal Form with parent & student signature
- Form is available in the Counseling Office
- DUE to Mr. Sumerel by 4 PM on Friday, March 20.





Early Dismissal for Juniors

- Must be <u>ENROLLED</u> in a Greenville Tech. class <u>both</u> <u>semesters</u>!
- Required for less than 7 class periods
- Must be classified as a junior
- Must be enrolled in courses needed for SC Diploma
- Must be scheduled for minimum of 4 class periods
- Must complete Early Dismissal Form with parent & student signature
- Form is available in the Counseling Office
- DUE to Mrs. Rogers by 4 PM on Friday, March 20.



Virtual School Enrollment

- Courses are not self-paced but rather adhere to a strict schedule in completing sequential modules.
- All classes have a specified start and end date.
- Required proctored final exam RHS will schedule this.
- Online classes are <u>very rigorous</u> and will often require more of your time than a regular class at your physical school.
- Many students find the rigors and schedules of virtual classes to be very difficult.



Virtual School Enrollment

- It is recommended that if students have the room in their schedule to take courses at RHS, they should!
- Registering for a Virtual School course does <u>NOT</u> guarantee enrollment in the VS course!
- Courses fill up quickly and have been cancelled after being publicized.
- Students may begin seeing their Counselor to sign up for a Summer VS course on May 5.



Virtual School Enrollment

- Students <u>MUST</u> log into the course each day and complete assignments.
- Students who fail to log in on a regular basis will be dropped from the course and the student will receive a WF for the course
- A WF is reflected on the transcript and a grade of 61 is calculated into the student's GPA.




Virtual School & Student Athletes

 The NCAA has very strict guidelines regarding credit for courses taken online, such as courses offered by the Greenville County Virtual School. Many online courses <u>ARE NOT APPROVED</u> by the NCAA. Before enrolling in any online class be sure to consult with your high school's Athletic Director and your School Counselor to determine if the online course that you are considering is approved for credit by the NCAA.




