# **DRESS CODE - SEVIER T-SHIRTS ALLOWED!**

Official and unaltered Sevier T-shirts or closed-neck Sevier hoodies will be allowed without a collared shirt on any school day. On game days only, school athletes (MS or HS) may wear their jerseys (with sleeves) without a collar underneath.

**Note key requirements** of the Sevier Middle School Dress Code. See the website for full details.

- 1. All students wear a polo-type or button front shirt.
- collared and sleeved (NOW ALLOWING OFFICIAL SEVIER SHIRTS SEE ABOVE)
- designed to close across the chest to the neck
- turtlenecks and mock-turtlenecks are allowed
- not too tight or show cleavage
- 2. Clothing must cover the waist and back no skin showing between the top and bottom garments
- 3. Pants, jeans, shorts, and skirts:
- At the natural waistline --undergarments and athletic shorts may not be visible
- wear a belt if necessary
- not too baggy, nor immodestly form to the body
- skin tight pants and thin or clingy warm-up pants are not allowed
- running shorts and pajama pants not allowed
- opaque leggings or "jeggings" must be under a skirt or shorts reaching fingertip length
- no tears, shreds, or holes in lower garments may show above the fingertips
- skirts and shorts must be fingertip length, AND must assure modesty when seated, travelling the stairs, or managing daily activities
- 4. No flip flops, athletic slides, or bedroom shoes
- 5. Facial jewelry is permitted only on the ears.

# Book-bags & cell phones stay in locker

Book-bags and cell phones will go to the locker on arrival at the grade level hallway and remain until pick-up after the last Core Academic class.

CINCH-BAGS, SMALL BAGS & DEVICE SLEEVES are the only bags allowed in classrooms. Bag must cinch by string at top to draw bag closed. No *Kahvu* or structured book-bag to class. String cinch may have shoulder pads. All bags must fit under desks during class. The compartment under the desks measures 10" x 8" x 14". If bags do not fit in this space they will need to be placed in lockers. Aisles must be left clear for safe movement around the room. Student must carry between locker visits:

- Issued textbooks, notebooks, supplies, PE clothes
- Devices must be carried separately from books to protect the screens

A device sleeve (parent purchase) is recommended. The 6th & 7th grader Dell Chromebook 11 is 12" long, 9" across, and 1" deep. The 8th grader Dell 3340 13" laptops are 13" long, 10" across, and 1 1/2" deep

# Student Drop-off and Pick-up — SAFETY IS EVERYONE'S RESPONSIBILITY

## School doors open at 7:30am, classes start at 8:30am, and dismissal is at 3:25pm.

**Bus Rider Drop-off and Pick-up** are in the rear of the school. We do not expect any change to bus routes or times for each bus stop. The Transportation Dept. will send information to confirm these times and you can view the map at Open House.

Car Rider Drop-off and Pick-up – For safety, All students must be dropped off and picked up ON CAMPUS.

Your actions as a driver impact the safety and efficiency of this system. Please be respectful of others and comply with all procedures.

**Morning drop-off** for all car riders is in the *front* driveway. Cars will stack quickly. **Pull forward nearest the crosswalk** before you let your child out. Drivers must turn right to exit from 8:10-8:30.

#### Afternoon pick-up

NEW: A 7th or 8th grader RIDING WITH a 6th grader may be picked up in the rear drive.

- 6th grade car pick-up is in the rear driveway. NO ARRIVAL before 3:00. Paris Elem. buses are still there. This pick-up closes at 3:40.
- 7th & 8th grader car pick-up is in the front driveway. You may double stack in the front driveway after 2:45.
- No student may be picked up along the road or across the street.
- 1. Drivers must turn right leaving the front car line between 3:25 3:45.
- 2. Drivers using the rear line pick-up will be routed through the faculty parking area for exit. You may not enter the Sevier bus area.
- 3. Rear pick-up drivers must be **cautious** when pulling out at the exit. Sunnydale Drive is narrow and buses will be passing sitting traffic to enter the drive.
- 4. At 3:45, all remaining car riders are called to the front sidewalk for pick-up.
- 5. **All riders must be picked up by 3:45.** If a specific work condition or high school driver arrangement prevents this arrival time, you must contact <u>bfalls@greenville.k12.sc.us</u>.

ALL Drivers, EVERYDAY: Follow all instructions of duty personnel. Through morning drop-off and beginning at 3:25:

Stop texting; put the phone down • Pull forward; tighten the line • Keep your younger children in the car • Watch all movement

NOTE to ALL — If you have any change in your transportation arrangements, you must submit a Transportation Change form to the Guidance Office.



## Where Do I Go on the 1st Day?



On the first day of school, students should report to the following locations after the opportunity to eat breakfast in the cafeteria.

# Cell Phones and Personal Devices

Cell phones and personal electronic devices are to remain turned off and in the locker until the last exit of the academic hallway. While attending1st period or 6th period Related Arts, the phone must remain off and in the book-bag. The phone stays off and in the specified place from arrival at school until the student exits the building to go home after 3:25.

Any adult who finds a student in possession or use of a cell phone in violation of this policy must report the student to the school administration. The adult or administrator will confiscate the device. The student may pick up the device following the announcements at the end of the day. Repeat offenses will require parent pick-up of the device and result in disciplinary consequences.



#### FREE BREAKFAST FOR ALL STUDENTS

Free breakfast is available to all students each morning and will be served from 7:45 - 8:15am. Students are not allowed to bring

outside food or beverages into the building for breakfast.

Students may bring only water to class in a clear container. Water bottles will be permitted in class at teacher discretion.

# COMPLETE YOUR FREE & REDUCED LUNCH APPLICATIONS

All students receive free breakfast. Student lunch meals cost \$2.50, reduced price is \$0.40. All are encouraged to complete a free/reduced lunch application. Paper applications will be provided at school, however for quicker processing, complete the online application at <a href="http://greenville.schoollunchapp.com">http://greenville.schoollunchapp.com</a>. Applications for free/reduced lunch should be returned before October 6, as the grace period for last year's participants ends at this date.

# ATTTENDANCE AT SCHOOL

All students take 6 classes daily (ELA, Math, Science, Social Studies, & 2 Related Arts per semester). The school year contains 180 days. To earn credit, students must attend 85 days of each 90-day (semester) course and at least 170 days of each 180-day course. Any absence in excess of ten (10) days may cause the loss of credit for the year. The first ten (10) days absences may be lawful, unlawful, or a combination. All absences beginning with the eleventh (11) must be lawful and can be excused only if they fall within the guidelines outlined in the Student Handbook.

# Perfect Attendance Criteria (Revised May 2016):

The definition of an absence at a Greenville County Middle School is missing more than one-half of any single class period for which a student is enrolled, or multiple class periods for which a student is enrolled, during a school day. Absence in any part of the school day for a minimum of more than one-half class period, even if the student was present for all other portions of that same school day, by definition excludes a student from being determined to have Perfect Attendance.

# **EARLY DISMISSAL PROCEDURES**

Parents are reminded to send a note with your student to be given to the front office as they arrive at school. The note should contain the student's name, the time of dismissal, reason for dismissal, parent signature and phone number. The student will be given a dismissal slip to present to the class teacher as permission to be released from that class at the pre-arranged dismissal time. Please note that walk-in dismissals and call-in dismissals will required students to be released at class change. The office staff are unable to call into a classroom during instructional time. Our bell schedule is on the website in the Important Documents section in the Blue Box . After 2:25 p.m., the school will only release PREARRANGED dismissals.
