## **Note from the Principal**

Dear Parents.

We are thankful for the parents of our Sevier students. Our children are happy, focused. and learning — preparing for what lies ahead. Your reinforcement of consistent school attendance helps us prepare them well.

When a student misses school, they miss a lot. Content and skills are more difficult to learn through make-up tasks, without face to face instruction. The challenge of multiple assignments to be completed as instruction in new concepts unfolds can be overwhelming.

As Winter Break approaches, we must emphasize student focus on learning responsibilities. Classes continue to move forward with challenging curriculum and there is much to accomplish before the end of the 2nd Quarter. Please support your child's success by minimizing school absences and early dismissals.

Per Greenville County Schools policy, a referral is entered and a Parent/Student Intervention Conference is required after 3 consecutive unverified or unexcused absences, or a total of 5 unverified or unexcused absences. An unverified absence is one without a parent or doctor note. Unexcused absences include vacations or events, and lack of transportation.

Even so, students who are ill should not come to school. To minimize the spread of viruses, district policy states that students with a fever are considered contagious and may not return to school until they are fever free without medicine for 24 hours.

If an early dismissal cannot be avoided, please follow procedures — send a note before 1st period. Dismissals that are not pre-arranged will require that the student be dismissed during class change, when the front office can call into the room. Thank you for trusting us to bring out the best in your child.

#### **Early Dismissal Procedures**

Parents are reminded to send a note with your student to be given to the front office as they arrive at school. The note should contain the student's name, the time of dismissal, reason for dismissal, parent signature and phone number. Please note that walk-in dismissals and call-in dismissals will required students to be released at class change. The office staff are unable to call into a classroom during instructional time. #### **Procedure for Absences**

Please remember to send a reason for absence note the day your child returns to school. The note should contain the following: Student's full name, date(s) of absence, reason for absence, contact information & parent/guardian signature. Notes are to be turned into the front office prior to entering class. Students are responsible for requesting and making up missed assignments in each class.
