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Recently, Mr. Grady and Mr. Falls met with 7th and 8th students to re-state expectations and encourage success. The topics discussed during the meetings included:

• Laptops must be charged each night and in class every day. They must be closed and carried carefully between classes.

 Students must have their agenda at all times. It helps to keep students organized and it is a student's pass throughout the building.

- Book bags must be stored under the desk during class in order to keep clean and safe walkways.
- ID's must be worn around the neck and showing at all times.
- Leggings can be worn to school ONLY if they are covered by a fingertip length skirt, shorts, or top.
- Heavy winter jackets must be stored in lockers during the school day. Blankets are not allowed at school.
- Cell phones must be kept in lockers. These must stay off and in the specified place from arrival at school until the student exits the building to go home after 3:25. If a cell phone is seen or goes off during class, the teacher will ask the student to place the phone on the teacher's desk until an administrator can arrive to escort the student to their locker so that they may place the phone inside it. A disciplinary consequence will be applied.
- School issued laptops and Chromebooks are for educational use only. Repeated off-task use will
 result in short-term confiscation and/or disciplinary action.

Mr. Grady and Mr. Falls praised the students for a successful and positive 1st Semester and encouraged students to finish strong. A similar meeting will be held with 6th graders in the near future.

If your child has already received this vaccination, please send this documentation in to Nurse Waters in the health room as soon as possible. On February 25, consent forms for DHEC's onsite Tdap vaccination clinic will be given to 6th graders who have not presented Sevier with record of their vaccination. Parents should send in documentation of their child's Tdap vaccination, or return the completed authorization form to allow their student to receive the Tdap vaccination during our scheduled clinic on April 20th. Consent forms are due no later than March 11th.

Sevier Middle School - Falcon News

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Sevier is a STEAM-focused school. Problem and project-based learning is a key method used to master the standards and promote critical thinking, collaboration, communication, and creativity.

6th Grade



The 6th grade STEAM unit was inspired by the recent flooding that occurred in South Carolina. Students have worked in groups to create a model of a viable community that can withstand the catastrophic forces of nature and serve the needs of its people. Math classes determined the space specifications for the buildings of the community, while

Science classes focused on testing, design, and construction. ELA classes studied the causes and impact of the flooding, researched structural design elements, and reflected daily on the processes underway. In Social Studies classes, students studied the social and political aspects of communities including decision making and con-



flict resolution. Each

student group elected a representative to meet with the House of Representatives to make decisions that impact their community. View our communities at Falcon Flight

7th Grade



Seventh graders took part in a STEAM unit called *Innovation Station*. Students worked in groups to develop an idea for innovating an existing product and

presented their ideas to a panel of community members, our very own Shark Tank Panel. The students then worked to video a marketing pitch through English/Language Arts and design a scale drawing in Math. Students watched each other's marketing pitches and collaboratively posted comments and suggestions via Edmodo. The teachers are selecting the top 10. They

along with the overall Top 4 will be announced at a special assembly soon.



8th Grade



The driving question of 8th grade's STEAM project was "How did the Civil War affect South Carolina?" Students chose research topics from questions related to Social Studies standards. In Social Studies classes, students investigated facts and wrote commentary to answer their topic question. In

ELA, students researched their topics through literature and explored symbolism through the lens of life in South Carolina during the Civil War. One topic studied was quilt making during the Civil War with an emphasis on the use of quilts to send

messages within the slave community, known as slave codes. Students prepared a Google slides presentation in ELA to present in Social Studies class. In Math, students integrated the symbolism of the slave codes used in quilt blocks with glass art to create quilt tiles made using linear equations. The glass tiles, when completed, will be "pieced" together to create a glass quilt art piece.
