language and culture, compare them to the languages and cultures of others, examine cultures through a language and perspective other than their own.

- 4. Langue and cultural proficiency lead to an interdisciplinary view of the curriculum. We want our students to act with greater awareness of self, other cultures, and their own relationship to those cultures. We want every student to make interdisciplinary connections.

Definitions:

Mother-Tongue: The language a student uses at home or outside of an educational / classroom setting. The term can refer to the language a student was first exposed to from birth. The term may include several languages and in some cases a dialect. Mother-tongue may be preferred to as native language, first language, heritage language or preferred language.

Language B: describes the language(s) learned subsequently to the first language.

Language Acquisition: The class that provides instruction and support for the learning of the language B.
