Our Goals

- 1. Increase family engagement by providing opportunities for families to interact with their children in the school atmosphere.
- 2. Increase the number of students who score meets or exceeds on SCREADY ELA from 45.5 % to 51.9% by creating a designated Intervention/Enrichment block, implementing Lexia for all students, assigning interventionists who serve all grades, and co-planning HMH Into Reading.
- 3. Increase the number of students who score meets or exceeds on SCREADY Math from 41.8 % to 48.6% by implementing guided math groups in all grades, attendance at all Title I math cohorts, DreamBox for all students, a math interventionist, and utilization of the Title I math academic specialist.








2024 SCREADY Data
