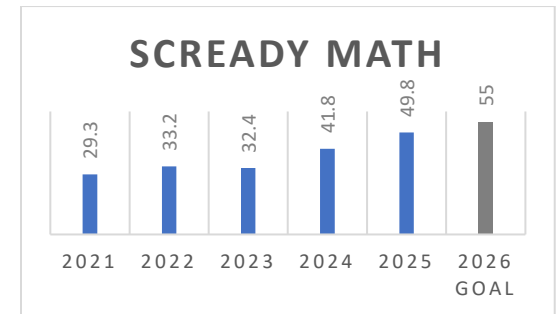
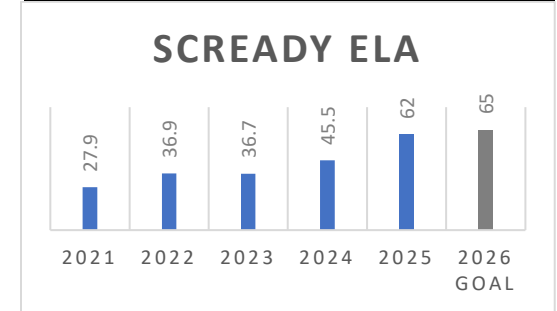
Our Goals

1. Increase family engagement by providing opportunities for families to interact with their children in the school atmosphere.
2. Increase the number of students who score meets or exceeds on SCREADY ELA from 62% to 65% by creating a designated Intervention/Enrichment block, implementing Lexia for all students, assigning interventionists who serve all grades, and co-planning HMH Into Reading.
3. Increase the number of students who score meets or exceeds on SCREADY Math from 49.8% to 55% by implementing guided math groups in all grades, attendance at all Title I math cohorts, Aleks/Aleks Adventures for all students, a math interventionist, and utilization of the Title I math academic specialist.
