Writing

- ◆ Help your child practice writing letters (uppercase and lowercase).
- ◆ Teach your child how to write his/her name with an uppercase first letter and the remaining letters in lowercase.
- ◆ Write in shaving cream in the bathtub, salt or sugar in a cake pan or in finger paint to make practicing writing more fun and multisensory.

Reading

- ◆ Read to your child each day.
- ◆ Show your child the front cover and talk to him/her about how we read from front to back and left to right on the page.
- ◆ Point to words as you read.
- ◆ When reading, have your child make predictions about what might happen next.
- ◆ Ask comprehension questions at the end of the book, such as What happened? Who are the characters? What is the setting?

Math

- ◆ Have your child help sort the laundry or snacks by various categories—by color, shape or by who an item belongs to.
- ◆ Using crayons of different colors, encourage your child to make patterns by repeating colors.
- ◆ Read a calendar and count down the days to a special event.
- ◆ Collect objects in nature and sort them by size, shape, color or type. Count the number of objects in each category.
- ◆ Play numbers games, such as counting the number of steps you take, trucks you see while driving or counting the number of items in the laundry.
- ◆ Practice counting to 20.
- ◆ Practice identifying numbers 1 to 10. Once they know them, practice 11 to 20.
- ◆ Practice counting from ten to zero.
- ◆ Find objects that are squares, circles, triangles, rectangles and hexagons.

Letter and Sound Recognition

- ◆ Play games to help your child recognize letters and sounds of the alphabet (uppercase and lowercase).
- ◆ Match upper and lowercase letters using refrigerator magnets.

Beginning Sounds

- ◆ Find items around the house that begin with the same sound and identify the letter that makes each sound.

Behavior

- ◆ Look at the speaker to show you're listening.
- ◆ Answer in a complete sentence.
- ◆ Sit still to listen to a story.
- ◆ Follow multistep directions, like -pick up your toy cars, put them in the bin, then make your bed.
