Mission Statement

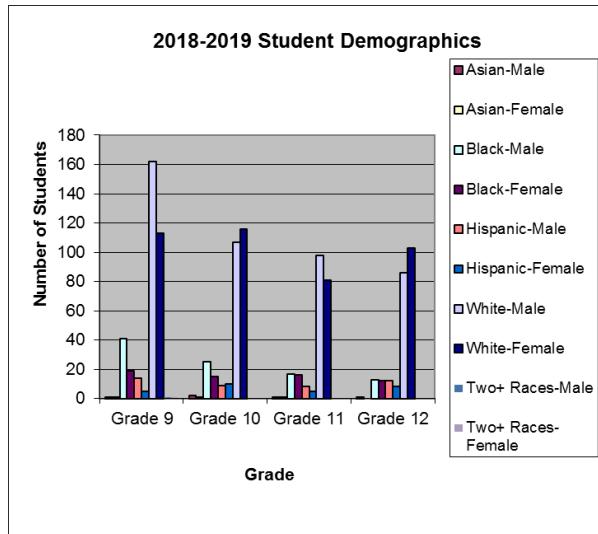
We exist to educate students both academically and socially so that they become responsible citizens of our local and global community.

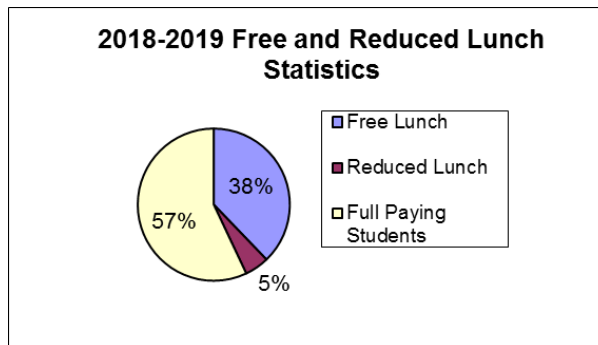
