2018-2019 Registration Timeline

- Rising 9th grade TRHS students will choose electives during the months of Feb/March at their middle school.
- Rising 9th grade academic teachers will make recommendations for next course progression.

2018-2019 Registration

- Rising 10th-12th grade students will register for classes during a registration meeting with their counselor.
- Meetings will begin the week of Feb. 12th.
- Please contact your student's counselor if you would like to participate in the meeting.
- Students will select elective courses and review academic course selections.

Academic Course Selections

- Your student's teachers are currently recommending your student for the proper course level (college prep, honors, AP/IB)
- When your student registers for classes, he/she will review his academic course recommendations.

Student Request Letters

- Your student will bring home a letter detailing his/her requests for the 2018-2019 school year in April.
- This is another opportunity for you to make changes to your student's selections. You may make notes on the student's letter.
- For current TRHS students, these are due to guidance by Monday, April 23, 2018.

Course Request Deadline

- For the 2018-2019 school year, TRHS is implementing a date by which all schedule changes must be submitted to guidance in writing. This will be <u>Wednesday</u>, <u>June 6</u>, <u>2018</u>.
- This includes <u>academic course changes</u> and <u>elective change</u> requests.
- This includes first and second semester classes.
- After this date, schedule changes will be limited and must meet specific criteria.
