End of Course exams are state mandated exams that students must take at the conclusion of US History, English 1, Algebra 1 Part B, Algebra 1, and Biology. These exams count 20% of a student's final grade in the course.

The ASVAB is a multi-aptitude test designed to measure your abilities. It consists of 10 short tests that can assess academic strengths. The State Department of Education encourages the use of this test for career counseling. This exam is offered to interested juniors in November.

The PSAT is given to all sophomores in October. College bound juniors are encouraged to sign up to take the exam again. This exam measures verbal and mathematical reasoning abilities important to academic performance and can serve as a great estimate of a student's scores on the SAT college entrance exam. The PSAT provides entry for important national scholarship and student recognition programs when taken during your junior year of high school.
