Westcliffe Elementary School is helping all students develop the world class skills and life and career characteristics of the Profile of the South Carolina Graduate by providing a safe, caring, and academically challenging learning environment. We provide such an environment through the implementation of our Westcliffe's Mission: "In cooperation with home and community, Westcliffe Elementary School prepares students to be life-long learners and citizens of good character in an ever-changing world." We demonstrate this vision by challenging our students to reach their full potential and achieve more than expected. We accomplish this through continuous professional development for our faculty and staff to ensure the consistent use of best practices.

Our teachers are always seeking to learn and use new and effective instructional strategies in the classroom. Some of these strategies include programs such as Thinking Maps, Fountas and Pinnell Balanced Literacy Model, Everyday Math, Accelerated Reader, Write from the Beginning, Six Traits of Writing, Singapore and AIMS Math, each of which is designed to enhance student learning. We also have STC/FOSS Science Kits, small group guided reading, STEM and a Virtual Science lab teacher. Westcliffe also supports our children through Math and Reading Interventionist, a Response to Intervention teacher (RtI), and a literacy specialist. These programs provide support to all students in reading and math from kindergarten through fifth grade. We are very proud of our strong history of academic success at Westcliffe Elementary.

In addition to our academic programs, we also have various programs that focus on the development of the whole child. We believe that character development and physical wellbeing are integral to our students' lifelong success. Some of our featured programs include a Running Club, Bicycle and Pedestrian Safety, and character building activities such as the Pillars of Character Program and character-focused words of the week.

Our education program is further enhanced through community partnerships and grants with groups like Public Education Partners, Greenville Federal Credit Union and Palmetto Pride. Our partners support our Million Minute Reading Program through take home book donations and the purchase of books for our Media Center. Westcliffe has also partnered with Feed the Hungry to provide students food over the weekend through the Weekend Snack Backpack Program.

At Westcliffe Elementary, we believe the school, family, and community must share the educational responsibility of our young children. We are committed to meeting the needs of our children to be learners today and leaders tomorrow to empower our future South Carolina graduates and world leaders to achieve their personal best.





# **SCPASS**



"Not Met": student did not meet the grade level standard.






#### Our School: Percent Met and Above for each grade level
