The Mighty Generals

In February of 1970, the federal government mandated the desegregation of schools in Greenville, SC. In the middle of the school year, 12,000 of the county's 57,000 students were reassigned in an effort to bring each school's racial balance in line with the overall demographics. Imagine the fear and violence that pursued.

Wade Hampton High was South Carolina's largest high school at the time and named in honor of Wade Hampton III, a Confederate general and former governor who descended from an influential slave-owning South Carolina family.

I spoke very briefly at the Faculty Meeting about the book, The Mighty Generals written by Mike Chibbaro (WH Alumni). This story is a special one and I think our students should know it. It will be good for the community as well. We pride ourselves on our positive school culture and school spirit. I think this could open the door for a larger conversation for our school centered on cultural competency and inclusion. The 1970 and 1971 basketball teams (players and coaches) played a critical role in creating a more inclusive culture at WHHS despite the segregationist pressure at the time.

This February will mark 50 years since the first African American students entered our building as students. As such, I pulled together a small team to imagine a way to capitalize on this story, pay homage to our alumni, and make connections to Black History Month. We want you to be aware of the following activities that will happen to educate our students about these giants on whom shoulders we stand.

Friday, February 7, 2020

- Two 45-minute Assemblies during 2nd Block (schedule coming soon).
 - Clyde Mayes and Norman MacDonald will be the honored guests and speakers.
 - We will have the entire student body and faculty present.
 - Students will preview a 5 minute video that highlights the book prior to the assembly.
- Host a "Throwback Night" at the Varsity Basketball Game vs. Easley High School
 - Halftime Presentation to the 1970 and 1971 teams (coaches and players)
 - Book signing before and during the game (cafeteria)
 - Pictures with the 1970 and 1971 players/coaches (cafeteria)
 - Display of old letters, newspaper clippings, paraphernalia, etc in the cafeteria/foyer area.
- Proceeds from book sales will be donated back to the school.

Attributes of a General- Communication

The focus Attribute of a General for the month of January is **Communication**.

As a new semester begins, teachers will have the opportunity to display this attribute within their classrooms by clearly communicating the learning goals and setting the expectations for their classroom environment. Being able to model effective communication daily and clearly defining communications expectations for students will help them succeed in school and in life.

It's easy to focus on spoken and written forms of communication, but studies show that 93% of all communication is nonverbal. So we must be mindful of how that impacts the message we are trying to deliver. Also, take time to think about what communication barriers your students may experience. One example would be earbuds in while speaking with other students or teachers.

Informing, Persuading, and Motivating are different functions of communicating with others. Being mindful of what we say and how we say it can either encourage or suppress a student's desire to reciprocate an open and honest dialogue.

Vaping Education

Monthly Fact

The popularity of electronic nicotine devices (or e-cigarettes) is on the rise, especially among teens. Not all e-cigarettes look alike, and they are often easy to hide. E-cigarettes can look like a USB drive, a pen, or a car key fob, to name a few. Vaping occurs when users inhale vapor from a liquid that has been heated by a battery-powered coil, as opposed to inhaling tobacco smoke from a cigarette. The liquid is flavored and contains nicotine as well as other chemicals.

A federal survey shows 27.5% of high school students have used an e-cigarette in the past 30 days.


