### PARENT BACKPACK ACCOUNTS

Please create your parent backpack account if you have not already done so by going to <a href="https://www.gcsbackpack.com/signin.aspx">https://www.gcsbackpack.com/signin.aspx</a>

Here you can check your student's grades in real time, attendance, and receive text/email notifications sent by the School. After completing the steps to create the account, you will receive a confirmation email telling you to visit the school to verify your identity.

### To complete verification...

- 1. **Email a copy of your Government ID to Guidance Clerks** (Mrs. Kirven) at <a href="mailto:rkirven@greenville.k12.sc.us">rkirven@greenville.k12.sc.us</a> or (Mrs. Childers) at <a href="mailto:mchilders@greenville.k12.sc.us">mchilders@greenville.k12.sc.us</a>.
- 2. One proof of custody is required (See photo below).
- 3. Please ensure your student's name is attached.
- 4. This has to be done prior to your account being approved by the school.



You will now need to visit your student's school to verify your identity and/or proof of custody as a parent guardian or non custodial guardian for the student. You must bring the following to verify your identity:

Government Issued Photo ID

And at least one of the following to verify custody of student (if not already on file with the school):

- · State/County issued birth certificate
- · Divorce/Separation Documents (if applicable)
- Court-Ordered Guardianship Papers (if applicable)
  (A notarized statement from parent or legal guardian is not sufficient.)
- Student emancipated by age (18 years)
  government issued photo ID / Birth Certificate
- · Notarized Educational Affidavit
- · Notarized Custodial Parent Affidavit

### **SCHOOLINKS**

Schoolinks is a new program that replaced Naviance as students' college and career portfolio. There are many features that the School Counseling Department is still learning about and will be sharing with students in the coming weeks. Students can now access and download their transcripts by logging into their Schoolinks account via Student Backpack in the Education Apps. Seniors will use Schoolinks to track college applications and request transcripts be sent to colleges. For a video guide and pdf information, visit the **School Counseling webpage**.

### UNDERCLASSMEN DUES

Underclassmen (Grades 9-11) Dues are collected each year to support the projects associated with the corresponding graduation classes. **The Class Dues are \$5!** 

This applies to Virtual students and in-person/E-learning students.

Students/Parents can one of three ways:

- 1. Pay dues to students' 1st Block teacher
- 2. Pay in the front office
- 3. Pay online at MySchoolBucks.com

### IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR SENIORS

#### Senior IGP meetings

Students and Parents are invited to sign up for a 30-minute Virtual IGP meeting with their School Counselor during the month of October. The meetings will be conducted

via Google Meets. There will be a 1-week window for students to sign up for a slot. After October 2nd, Counselors will assign meeting times for students who have not selected a time and the student will receive an email confirmation for their IGP appointment time.

- Choose a meeting time slot on an e-learning day or after you have left school (NOT during class time here at WHHS, FAC, or the Career Center). We do not want to pull students from their actual classroom instruction time. (Virtual Academy students can sign up for any available slot)
- Students and parents should discuss and decide on a meeting time that will work for both to attend together (if the parent plans to attend).

### How to sign up: Students needs to sign up while logged into their School Google account

- Click on the link of your School Counselor's name below to go to their Google Calendar.
- Click on the link that reads "Next available appointment slot on Oct..."
- Click on the box of the appointment day/time that you want. The student's name will automatically appear in the "what" box. Click Save.
- You will get an appointment confirmation box.
- To add your parent to the meeting so they will get the Google Meet link, click on "view/edit in Google Calendar", click the edit tool icon, then type your parent's email address under "Guests", then click "Save", then "Send". You and your parent/guardian will receive an email with the Google Meets link included!

### QUESTIONS ABOUT VIRTUAL INSTRUCTION

### Can parents or non-students be present and off-camera during virtual instruction?

Parents and legal guardians listening to or watching virtual instruction is permissible pursuant to FERPA and would be similar to a classroom observation. There is practically nothing that a school or teacher can do to prevent other individuals who are with the student from either watching or listening to virtual instruction other than to make sure that the links sent to students for either live instruction or for recordings are secure and not accessible to be joined by non-students.

### What about tutors or other individuals who are not parents or guardians helping a student?

As stated in the section immediately above, the reality of virtual instruction is that tutors and other individuals (including siblings) working with a student may have access to either live instruction or recordings while supporting a student. The parents/guardians and/or students are responsible for providing information and assignments to these individuals. While an arrangement between a parent and a tutor is preferred, parents and legal guardians may request specific permission for a tutor or another person supporting a student to be added on a student's account either in Google Classroom or in Student Backpack. ### PSAT FOR 11TH GRADERS

11th grade students have the opportunity to take the PSAT/NMSQT test in October 2020. 11th graders who are interested in participating in the PSAT/NMSQT will be required to pay a \$17.00 fee, which will be collected by Wade Hampton High School by using My School Bucks or by paying in the school counseling office. Students will have the opportunity to register and pay the required fee through **September 9**.

The PSAT/NMSQT test will be administered during the school day on October 14. Depending on COVID-19 conditions in early September, the school may select some students to test on October 29. You will be notified regarding a final determination of PSAT/NMSQT testing dates and scheduling students for the PSAT/NMSQT test.

PSAT scores determine eligibility for National Merit Scholarships. You may explore the link below to learn more about the PSAT/NMSQT test. Should you have any questions about the test, please contact your school counselor.

### PSAT FOR 10TH GRADERS

10th grade students have the opportunity to take the PSAT/NMSQT test in October 2020. In compliance with Proviso 1A.17 and as mandated in Section 59-18-340 of the Education Accountability Act, the test is administered to assess and identify curricular areas that need to be strengthened and reinforced. According to the law, schools shall use the assessment as a diagnostic tool to provide academic assistance to students whose scores reflect the need for such assistance. Schools will use the results of the assessment to provide guidance and direction for parents and students as they plan for postsecondary experiences.

The PSAT/NMSQT test is provided at no cost to you and is administered during the school day on October 14. Depending on COVID-19 conditions in early September, the school may select some students to test on October 29. You will hear from me in early September, regarding a final determination of PSAT/NMSQT testing dates and scheduling students for the PSAT/NMSQT test. 


