We received word that out school has earned high National and metro-area rankings in 2021 Best High Schools, which U.S. News. Below is our school's updated U.S. News profile page, with details about our rankings:

We are ranked seventh within South Carolina. Students have the opportunity to take Advanced Placement® coursework and exams. The AP® participation rate at Wade Hampton High is 60%. The total minority enrollment is 42%, and 33% of students are economically disadvantaged.

As it stands, Wade Hampton High is:

- #1 out of 15 high schools in Greenville County Schools
- #1 in Greenville Metro Area Schools
- #7 in South Carolina high schools
- #1296 in National Ranking

SCHOOL REPORT CARD PARENT SURVEY

Section 59-18-900 of the Education Accountability Act requires that annual school report cards include "evaluations of the school by parents, teachers, and students." Parent perceptions as collected in the Parent Opinion Survey appear on our school report card and provide school staff with insight to issues within our school. Additionally, results from the Parent Opinion Survey are used by the Education Oversight Committee to meet the requirements of Section 59-28-190 of the Parental Involvement in Their Children's Education Act.

Although the Parent Opinion Survey has been administered for many years, only parents of students in the highest grade in elementary and middle schools and parents of 11th graders in high schools previously were afforded the opportunity to respond to the paper survey. This year the survey has been moved to an online platform and is accessible via computer and mobile device. All parents of students in grades K-12 may now participate.

Once at the survey, choose either the English or Spanish version of the survey to complete.

Before opening the survey, the name of the school will appear, and you will be asked to confirm that you are completing the survey for the correct school. Each school where your children are enrolled will provide you with their school ID.

You will receive a letter from the State Superintendent of Education with additional information. Please read that letter before completing the survey.

The survey is anonymous, but if you feel uncomfortable in responding to any question you may skip that question. The survey will note that a question has been left unanswered, but you can click continue to proceed without answering the question.

<u>Summer Adventure</u> will be open to the public starting June 1st and will include our new Environmental Science and Sustainability Building housing awesome exhibitry, a traveling exhibit Be the Dinosaur, and a new program called Nature Exchange. Harrison Hall, the Living History Farm, Butterfly Garden, and new outdoor Dinosaur Trail will be part of Summer Adventure.

STUDENT INTERNATIONAL TRAVEL

Students will be given guidance upon their return to the U. S. from international travel. They will receive travel quarantine guidance based on answers provided. Administration will share the guidance we receive with the student's parent **and our school nurse** who will monitor compliance. Students will be provided 2 options for return to school after international travel quarantine: A 7 day quarantine with documentation of a negative COVID viral PCR or antigen (rapid) test result between days 3 and 5 with return to school on day # 8 or a 10 day quarantine with return to school on day #11. The rapid test can only be used to return early from a quarantine caused by international travel, not due to a quarantine caused by known exposure.



STUDENT ATTENDANCE (IN-PERSON STUDENTS)

We have heard from a significant number of parents who do not want to commit their student to the Virtual Program for the remainder of this school year (because they may not have the option to return to in-person class if conditions improve), but they also do not want to send their children in accord with the current attendance plan because of the high COVID spread in our community. To ensure consistency across the district:

- Be reminded that parents have the ability to "excuse" 10 of their children's absences. As
 Principal, Dr. Grant has the option of considering hardships or individual circumstances to
 allow further absences.
- Once parents make the choice between the Virtual and Traditional programs, their children are expected to follow that program's attendance plan. They are not allowed to choose the traditional (in-person) and simultaneously stay home for full-time eLearning.
- At the high school level, students who are "excused" by a parent note can participate in
 eLearning during those 10 days since classes are being livestreamed and eLearning is still
 occurring for the 25% of in-person students who are home each day on the 75% plan.
- When students are not physically present in the building on a scheduled attendance day, students will be marked absent, whether they are elementary, middle, or high school students.
