## Statement on Bullying

# What is bullying?

As provided in the South Carolina Safe Schools Climate Act, Greenville County Schools prohibits acts of harassment, intimidation or bullying of a students by another student or students, staff, or third parties that interferes with or disrupts a student's ability to learn and the schools responsibility to educate its students in a safe and orderly manner.

"Harassment, intimidation, or bullying" is defined as a gesture, an electronic communication, or a written, verbal, physical, or sexual act that a reasonable person should know will have the effect of:

- a) Harming a student, physically or emotionally, or damaging a student's property, or placing a student in reasonable fear of personal harm or damage to his property; or
- b) Insulting or demeaning a student or group of students in such a way as to cause substantial disruption in, or substantial interference with, the orderly operation of the school. (BoardDocs:Policy JCDAG)

Bullying is different from a single incident of teasing. It is also distinct from the normal conflicts of childhood. It is not bullying when two children of approximately equal strength or power have a fight. In addition to being physical, bullying can also be verbal and psychological in nature.

# Bullies may:

- Spread rumors about others
- Write nasty things about classmates
- Intentional exclude others
- Take or damage other students' possessions
- Repeatedly taunt or ridicule others
- Persuade peers to reject others
- Cyber bully by sending offensive messages to others via computer or cell phone.
